

Remarks on board Tuesday July the 4th these 24 hours begins with light breeze from S.W. the Brig heading in for Cape, saw a ship near the town the middle part of these 24 hours we had strong breeze from N.W. the Brig heading N. to the latter part of this day we made sail and took in the mainsail one reef in fore top sail Laid down the gill so ends this day Blowing hard wind N.W.

Remarks on board Wednesday July the 5th these 24 hours begins with strong breeze from S.W. the Brig on the E. side of Flores 2 P.M. we saw a Brig of the N. Coast of Flores 11 P.M. we wore ship steering N. with a light breeze from E.N.E. at 9 A.M. we saw a school of Blackfish we saw over board and caught one 10 A.M. took him a long side and put him in a raised forward. Flores bore by compass N.E. dist 10 miles so ends these 24 hours with fine breeze

Remarks on board Thursday July the 6th these 24 hours begins with strong breeze attended with squalls of rain at 1 P.M. we changed colors with a French flag of war. All the first part of these 24 hours we had strong breezes from S.W. the latter part of this day we had pleasant breeze from S.W. the Brig on the West side of Flores we saw two ships steering in for the land so ends this day the crew employed in ship's duty

Remarks on board Friday July the 7th these 24 hours begins with fine breeze from the S.W. the Brig heading in for Flores we had strong breeze the whole of these 24 hours from the N. the Brig of the N. side of Flores the latter part of these 24 hours we were sailing out Blackfish so ends this day Flores bore by compass E. dist 10 miles

Remarks on board Saturday July the 8th these 24 hours begins with fine breeze from the N. the Brig heading N. by E. the middle of the latter part of these 24 hours we had light wind the latter part of this day the Brig on the E. side of Flores and Cape Verde we saw two ships sailing of and our men Recounted so ends these 24 hours with fine breezes from N.W.

Remarks on board Sunday July the 9th these 24 hours begins with fine wind from S.W. the Brig heading in for Flores all the first part of these 24 hours we had fine breeze from S.W. the Brig heading E. of Shore and Blackfish so ends this day with fine breezes from N.W. the crew employed in ship's duty Flores 5 miles dist

Remarks on board Monday July the 10th these 24 hours begins with light wind from N.W. the Brig heading in for Flores the crew employed Restoring the After hold 7 P.M. we shortened sail heading to Flores 2 A.M. backed steering N. for Flores the middle of the latter part of these 24 hours we had backing winds attended with squalls of rain so ends this day

Remarks on board Tuesday July the 11th these 24 hours begins with thick foggy weather the Brig heading of and on Flores the middle of the latter part of this day we had strong breezes from the E. the Brig heading S so ends this day

Remarks on board Wednesday July the 12th these 24 hours begins with strong wind from E.S.E. 2 P.M. Flores bore by compass N. dist 25 miles we saw a ship steering in for Flores so ends this day

Remarks on board Thursday July the 13th these 24 hours begins with fine breeze from the E. the Brig heading S 5 P.M. we saw a school of sperm whales we saw over board and caught one 9 P.M. took her a long side and put her on board for butting 4 A.M. we commenced butting 11 A.M. we spoke the ship Falkenberg of Bedford 35 days out clean so ends these 24 hours with fine weather wind E.S.E.

Remarks on board Friday July the 14th these 24 hours begins with moderate breeze from the E. 4 P.M. we finished butting 5 P.M. commenced backing Flores bore by compass E. dist 15 miles 7 A.M. we was up a forest of Flores the latter part of this day the Brig heading S.W. so ends this day

Remarks on board Saturday July the 15th these 24 hours begins with light breeze from the E. the first part of these 24 hours light breeze the latter part calm say 3 sail of Flores so ends these 24 hours all hands employed trying out Blubber

Remarks on board Sunday July the 16th these 24 hours begins with calm weather 2 P.M. finished backing put over oil under Deck the first part of these 24 hours we had calm weather the latter part fine breeze from the E. the Brig heading S of Flores so ends this day

Remarks on board Monday July the 17th these 24 hours begins with fine wind from E. Flores bore by compass N. dist 15 miles all the first part of these 24 hours we had fine wind from the E. the Brig of the S.W. of Flores the latter part of these 24 hours we had strong wind from the N.E. so ends this day
