Remarks on board Friday Aug the 4<sup>th</sup> these 24 hours  
begins with light breeze from the E 2 PM we took  
our whaler & Long Side and took one on board  
at 4 AM when we commenced cutting 10 AM we finished  
we started the Woggs we saw a ship of Steam so ends  
these 24 hours with light wind from the E N E  
Lat 34° 22' Long 41° 55' 1848

Remarks on board Saturday Aug the 5<sup>th</sup> these 24 hours  
begins with light wind from the E N E we saw two  
schools of Blackfish the middle part of this day we  
had squally weather the latter part light breeze  
and cloudy so ends this day trying out blubber

Remarks on board Sunday Aug the 6<sup>th</sup> these 24  
hours begins with light wind from the E the Brig  
heaving to under short sail at the first part of these  
24 hours we had light wind from the N N W the middle  
and latter part fine breeze attended with Rain all  
hands employed Peeling so ends this day Rainy haul

Remarks on board Monday Aug the 7<sup>th</sup> these 24 hours  
begins with light wind from the S W the Brig heaving to E S E  
3 PM finished Stowing down our oil blubber up the  
deck we had light wind from N by N the Brig heaving  
S W so ends this day Lat 34° 23' Long 41° 50' 1848

Remarks on board Tuesday Aug the 8<sup>th</sup> these 24 hours  
begins with light wind S S W we saw Grampuses all the  
24 hours we had light wind the latter part the wind  
was from N N W the Brig heading S S W we saw Blackfish  
so ends this day Lat 34° 55' Long 40° 30' 1848

Remarks on board Wednesday Aug the 9<sup>th</sup> these 24  
hours begins with light wind from N N W the  
Brig heading S S W at the first part of these 24 hours  
we had light wind from N N W at 4 AM we took ship  
steering S S W 1 1/2 AM we saw a sail steering S E  
we found our boat and went on board and  
we found that she was a French Brig 18 days from  
New York bound to Batavia we got there tomorrow  
so ends this day with thick weather attended with  
squalls of Rain Lat 40° 55' Long 33° 28' 1848

Remarks on board Thursday Aug the 10<sup>th</sup> this day begins  
with squally weather with N by N all these 24  
hours we had squally weather with N N the first  
part of this day the Brig was heading N N W  
the latter part to the N N W Lat 35° 12' Long 41° 05' 1848

Remarks on board Friday Aug the 11<sup>th</sup> these 24 hours  
begins with light wind from the N N W attended with  
squalls of Rain the latter part the same the Brig  
heading N N so ends this day Lat 32° 52' N  
Long 41° 22' W 1848

Remarks on board Saturday Aug the 12<sup>th</sup> these  
24 hours begins with light wind from N N W  
the middle part of these 24 hours light wind the  
latter part calm so ends this day Lat 33° 05' N  
Long 41° 38' W 1848

Remarks on board Sunday Aug the 13<sup>th</sup> this day  
begins with light wind from N N W the Brig heading  
N N W the middle and latter part the same the  
Brig heading N by N so ends this day Lat 33° 06' N  
1848

Remarks on board Monday Aug the 14<sup>th</sup> these 24 hours  
begins with broken weather 2 PM we had light wind  
from N N W the Brig heading N E we saw Grampuses the middle  
and latter part the same the Brig heading N N W so ends  
this day Lat 33° 24' N Long 42° 26' W 1848

Remarks on board Tuesday Aug the 15<sup>th</sup> these 24 hours begins  
with light wind from N N W the Brig heading N by N we saw  
Grampuses the middle and latter part we had fine breeze  
from the E N E the Brig heading N N W so ends this day  
Lat 33° 46' N Long 43° 02' 1848

Remarks on board Wednesday Aug the 16<sup>th</sup> these 24 hours begins  
with fine breeze from N N E the Brig heading N N W 4 AM  
made sail heading N by N 10 AM we saw Blackfish we saw  
our boats and hoisted them but could not strike 11 AM  
we came on board so ends this day with light wind from  
the E Lat 34° 20' N Long 43° 31' W 1848

Remarks on board Thursday Aug the 17<sup>th</sup> these 24 hours  
begins with light wind from the E the Brig heading N  
the middle and latter part of these 24 hours calm we  
Painting over reds Boards so ends these 24 hours  
Lat 34° 26' N Long 43° 48' W 1848

Remarks on board Friday Aug the 18<sup>th</sup> these 24 hours  
begins with light breeze from N by N 2 PM we  
took ship heading to the Eastward we saw Grampuses  
4 took ship heading N by N 10 AM we saw a Brig of  
our weather Band so ends this day Lat 33° 54' N  
Long 43° 57' W 1848

Remarks on board Saturday Aug the 19<sup>th</sup> these 24 hours  
begins with strong breeze from the E N E 4 PM we  
saw White Matter of our weather Band we stood towards it  
but could not ascertain what it was 5 PM we saw a sail  
steering S E 8 PM the schooner Dionysia Capt. Snow of  
Provincetown spoke us 4 months out with 170 barrels  
Spinn all the Capt. came on board and Lat the roads so  
ends this day Lat 33° 40' N Long 43° 57' W 1848
