Remarks Friday Sept the 27th these 24 hours begins with strong breeze from S & W the Brig heading N the crew employed fitting over Rigging & Am we hoist sail steering N & W 10 AM we saw a large sperm we sailed over board and got up with her the Boatsteers did not dart quick and she got clear and we became one hour so ends this day with strong breeze from S & W by S

Remarks on board Saturday Sept the 30th this day begins with strong wind from S & W we sail aboard that and a short distance from the first whale we saw and struck and struck over and the time parted and the whale went off and we came on board and took ship and stood the way that they were going when we saw them first 9 AM we saw them again we board over board and caught one large whale so ends these 24 hours with strong breeze from the East

Remarks on board Sunday Oct the 1st these 24 hours begins with strong breeze from the East 4 PM we took the whale a long sail and got ready for cutting at day light we commence cutting so ends this day with strong wind from the East

Remarks Monday Oct the 2nd these 24 hours begins with strong breeze from the E & W we finished cutting in the body of our whale and left the head and back of a son side and we started the works 10 AM we took in the remainder of our whale and blew up the deck the middle and latter part of these 24 hours we had light breeze from E & S so ends this day Boiling out blubber

Remarks Tuesday Oct the 3rd this day begins with light wind from the East the crew employed in boiling out our whale the first and middle part of these 24 hours we had light wind from the E the latter part squally so ends this day Boiling out blubber

Remarks Wednesday Oct the 4th these 24 hours begins with squally weather wind E & W all hours employed in boiling out blubber and standing down 6 AM we finished boiling out our whale 11 AM finished standing down blubber the deck so ends this day

Remarks on board Thursday Oct the 5th these 24 hours begins with strong breeze from E & W 6 PM we squared away for home steering N by W the middle and latter part of this day we had light wind from S & W so ends this day all hands employed in fitting over Rigging

Remarks Friday Oct the 6th this day begins with strong wind from S & W the Brig heading N with all sail set the middle part of these 24 hours we had squally weather wind N & W the Brig heading N by W under short sail so ends this day with strong wind

Remarks on board Saturday Oct the 7th these 24 hours begins with strong breeze from N & W the Brig heading N the Northward under short sail the middle and latter part of this day blowing a Gale of wind from N & W the Brig sailing under Spencer and trysail all hands employed in clearing sails so ends this day

Remarks on board Sunday Oct the 8th these 24 hours begins with Gale of wind 4 PM we bore aboard and set the foresail and single reefed topsail the Brig heading N by W the middle and latter part of this day we had strong breeze from the N the Brig heading N by W with all sail set

Remarks on board Monday Oct the 9th this day begins with strong wind from the N the Brig heading N by W with all topsails set for home the middle part of these 24 hours we had calm weather latter part strong breeze from N & W the Brig heading N by W with all sail set so ends this day

Remarks on board Tuesday Oct the 10th these 24 hours begins with strong wind from N & W the Brig heading N by W with all sail set all the first part of this day we had squally weather the latter part fine breeze from S & E the Brig heading N by W with all sail set so ends this day

Remarks on board Wednesday Oct the 11th this day begins with fine wind from S & E the Brig heading N by W with all sail set the middle and latter part of these 24 hours we had squally weather 2 AM the wind shifted to the N & W the Brig heading N under short sail so ends this day
