Fresh Gale all this 24 hours & very rough
the ship, coming off the south side of West
Island, called on shore to get the anchor
left on Monday at 8 o'clock and got
the anchor, & where off for the Charleston Group
with one anchor, 300 men short of a crew, at 12
past the white rocks on the N side of the
Island, so ends this day were here

April Friday the 28th sea and 1849
Fresh gale all this 24 hours, & rough ship sur-
rounding at 11 AM till sunset, then a fair
wind, at 6 o'clock set sail again & shot out
at 12 in lat 24° 30' Lon not ascertained
so ends the day & so hands were left as usual

Fresh gale, foggy, & East wind, the ship sur-
rounding at 11 AM till sunset, then a fair

Fresh gale the whole day, the ship sur-
rounding at 11 AM till sunset, then a fair

Monday the 1st May sea and 1849
Fresh Gale the first part of this 24 hours
last part very rough, & very cold, & very
surrounding at 12 past spoke the Brig *Carroll*
of Carrizosa, Capt. Glover, having to her
cannons, 600 men, 1000 lbs. Reported see a
large ship off of *Spencer Whales* in Lat 16° 15'
Lat 32, at 12 in Lat 29° 33' Lon 75° 11'

Light breeze from S.E. & ship running at 11
AM saw a sail to the West and up and down
saw a small Black ship at night
May Wednesday the 3rd sea and 1849
Light breeze from the S.E. & ship running at 11
AM saw a sail to the West and up and down

at 12 in Lat 29° 33' Lon 75° 11'

Cruising on the Charleston Group
May Thursday the 4th sea and 1849
All this 24 hours fresh gale from the
North East, & said to the S.W. at 3 PM
Landed for the beeches, made *Beem* and to be
Spencer Whales struck one to the *Sabote*
Bon, & saw a small ship in at 8 AM
& stood to the North at 12 PM

May Friday the 5th sea and 1849
First part of this day fresh gale from N.E.
at 2 PM set the work, saying at 12 PM
looking at 12 PM 31° 15' Spoke the *Brig Giles*
off from *Maninguel*, 5 weeks out clean, whale
bodies 15 & barrels. Lat 30° 30' Lon 75° 30'

May Saturday the 6th sea and 1849
Light breeze from the East, & ship running at 11
AM saw a sail to the West and up and down
saw a small Black ship at night
at 12 in Lat 30° 30' Lon 75° 30'

Sunday May the 7th sea and 1849
Light breeze from the S.E. & ship running at 11
AM saw a sail to the West and up and down
saw a small Black ship at night
at 12 in Lat 30° 30' Lon 75° 30'

May Monday the 8th sea and 1849
First part this 24 hours, fresh, last part fresh
wind from S.W. at 2 past a ship & *Brig* running
E. & W. ship has 100 first men, in company
with *Ch. Louisa* & *Phant*, at 6 o'clock set sail
& stood to the Southward, at 12 in Lat 30° 30' Lon 75° 30'

May Tuesday the 9th sea and 1849
Fresh gale the whole day, at 8 AM saw a large *Beach*
to the North, wind S.W. & ship running at 11
AM saw a sail to the West and up and down
saw a small Black ship at night
at 12 in Lat 30° 30' Lon 75° 30'
