

From the 20th sea and 1849
Fine weather the whole day, wind from East N East, changed the scales till 3 P.M. when it was right of them, at 2 P.M. kept the ship off for a Brig which proved to be Long's Brice Providence 3 m. out 90 Bones. Spent summer with her till 9 P.M. at 5 P.M. got all sail to Northward, at 12 in lat 35° 16' Lon 44° 54'

From the 21st sea and 1849
Fine weather, very smooth, wind from E N E at 6 P.M. took up sail, at 8 A.M. set in lat to the sea the Bonny Parker Cook, to Westward (at 6, at 12 in lat 34° 51' Lon 43° 56')

From the 22nd sea and 1849
First part this day fine weather, moderate wind from E N E, light fresh gales from at 1 P.M. saw the Belleisle Cook master 80 Bonnell's Spinnaker, had a gain at 5 A.M. set off for the Parker Cook, & gained with her till 10 P.M. at 11 A.M. set off. Cook's same as before, had a gain at 12 in lat 34° 56' Lon 44° 54' West.

July the 23rd sea and 1849
Fresh gales the whole 24 hours, from the E ward, gained with Parker Cook, Belleisle in sight at 4 A.M. set sail to Southward, at 1 P.M. saw the Bonny Parker Cook, & gained with her till 10 P.M. at 11 A.M. set off. Cook's same as before, had a gain at 12 in lat 34° 56' Lon 44° 54' West.

July the 24th sea and 1849
Fine weather the whole day saw a few sail passing to N at 6 P.M. took in sail at 5 P.M. got sail to Southward in the Parker Cook at 4 P.M. the ship off W at 11 A.M. when we were in lat 35° 01'

July the 25th sea and 1849
Fine weather the whole day, light wind from East N East, & smooth sea, & number of bones from at 12 in lat 35° 10' Lon 44° 46' today broke out the holds fore & aft.

Fine pleasant weather, light wind from Northward, & light breeze at 6 P.M. gained with the Sch. Belleisle, at 6 P.M. set whole sail & steered N E, & at 8 P.M. Belleisle, & two other shubers, lat 35° 11'

Fine weather the first part this day, & moderate fresh gales, & squally with rain, at 5 P.M. saw a schooner, & at 8 P.M. saw one to Southward, & at 10 P.M. saw a large ship, & at 11 P.M. saw a ship, & at 12 in lat 35° 16' Lon 44° 48'
