 7 8 sent sail & other after taking
 8 9 in sail, at 8 P.M. hauled
 9 10 sail again & saw at 11
 10 12 at 10 & 12 sunset & had
 11 12 30 & 25 fathoms water fine sandy
 12 12 bottom, at 10 reefed whole sail
 1 2 at 6 A.M. saw the south shore
 2 3 of Montserrat, left off S.E.
 3 4 till part of 10 hauled up N.
 4 5 & then N.W. part for 6
 5 6 squalls, at 10 saw a fleet
 6 7 of blackbird fishers at 12 ahead
