

Remarks on Board the Brig Medford 1850
 Monday June the 24 Commences calm Middle part Light
 winds from NW working up to the island of Corvo
 at 8 AM the Capt went on shore at 11 AM
 returned with a load of potatoes and onions pumpkins
 Ends Pleasant winds NW to W with the boat on
 shore

Tuesday June the 25 Commences with Pleasant weather the
 Capt on shore at 4 AM came on Board Middle part
 calm at 4 AM made sail Steered of ESE Ends fine
 weather winds North saw one hump back

Wednesday June the 26 first part of these 24 hours
 Light winds from NW at 6 AM spoke the Sch
 Robert Duke and took our Stern Boat from her
 Middle and Latter part fresh breezes from North
 crossing of the west side of Flores & Ends

Thursday June the 27 first part of these
 24 hours fresh winds from North beating
 up for the Island of Flores at 4 AM
 lowered a Boat and went in for one of
 our Boatsmen who had been on shore 4 days
 to visit his parents at 6 the Boat returned
 and we left the Island for the Western
 end of NW by NW winds NW by East
 at 8 AM last sight of the Island

Friday June 28 All these 24 hours moderate
 breezes from North to East Steering
 NW by W and WNW saw porpoises
 Lat by obs 34:10

Saturday June the 29 Commences with Light
 winds from East Steering WNW
 Middle part Light winds and variable Ends
 with fine weather Steering WNW winds
 South West
 Lat by obs 34:24

From the Islands to the Western ground 1850

First part of these 24 hours Light winds and fine
 weather Steering by the wind WNW by NW winds S by NW
 painted the 2 quarter Boats Middle and Latter part
 the same Lat by obs 39:30 Long by Cr 37:27:00 West

Monday July the first first of these 24 hours moderate
 winds from the South West Steering by the WNW by NW Middle
 part the same Ends with strong breezes from S by W
 to SSW Steering by the wind both in fly jib and top
 gallant sail saw 1 brace Lat by obs 39:27 Long 38:30:20

Tuesday July the 2 Commences with fresh breezes and
 rugged Steering by the wind W by North at one AM hatched
 ship to the South Squally with rain wind WSW
 Ends the same Steering by the wind South saw a
 hump back
 Lat by obs 38:50 Long 39:43:10

Wednesday July 3 Commences with fresh winds and Squally
 Middle and Latter the same Steering by the wind South
 wind WSW and rugged saw two sails Steering East
 Lat 37:40 Long 38:44

Thursday July the 4 Commences with fresh breezes
 from W South W and rough Squally reefed the main
 sail at 2 AM hatched ship to the North West
 at 7 AM single reefed topsail Middle part Squally
 and rugged at 7 AM saw a whaling Brig Steering to the
 Southward at 8 AM took in our main sail and jib
 wore ship to the Southward and Eastward Ends rugged
 wind South West
 Lat by obs 38:02 Long by Cr 39:50

Friday July the 5 Commences with strong gales
 from the S by W at 4 AM wore ship to the WNW
 Middle part the same ship to the SE at 2 AM calm
 with a large swell Ends calm and Light air from
 W by S saw one sail Lat by obs 38:17 Long 40:00

Saturday July the 6 Commences with fine breezes
 from the North East Steering South per compass
 at 4 AM lowered a Boat picked up a small Spar
 some ships Standing sail Boom Middle part Squally
 with rain at 6 AM wore Pleasant made sail Steering
 S by W Ends Pleasant wind WNW
