 NW and ruggid

 fresh winds from NW and ruggid at 6 AM spoke
 the Brig Samuel Capt of Providence to own Capt Hardy
 three months out Clear Shortened sail heading SE
 at 10 AM Capt Eyer went on board the Brig Samuel
 took and spent the day Ends ruggid saw a Bank
 Ship Steering to the North West
