Friday July the 19 All these 24 hours fresh
breezes from the S E Steering on either tack
Saw one sail All hands employed on Ships Duty

Saturday July the 20 Commences with strong
winds from the Eastward and Squally with rain
at Sunset Shortened Sail heading to the Northward
at daylight made all sail Steering west Ends
blew out winds East
Lat 32:10
Long 41:58:10

Sunday July 21 Commences with moderate breezes
from E Steering west at 1 o'clock Saw a school
of black fish leaped the boats and two one
cut him in and Steered west at Sunset
Shortened Sail and now we heading to the
Northward Ends with fine clear weather
wind E by N
Lat by obs 34:25
Long by Cr 42:42

Monday July the 22 First part of this 24 hours
light winds from East by N and clear weather
heading N by E per compass at 6 o'clock run of N
at day light made all sail Steering west
wind East at 8 o'clock saw two Schooners of
our Steamer now hailed up South
Ends fine Lat 34:11
Long 43:02

Tuesday July the 23 All these 24 hours
light wind from East S E to S E Steering
by the wind South and S E
Lat 33:43
Long 42:14

Wednesday July 24 First part of these 24
hours light wind from the S E and
fine weather Ends with moderate winds
S W Saw five sail Lat 33:35
Long 43:10

Thursday July the 25 Commences with light
winds from S W Steering by the wind to the
North and westward at 6 o'clock spoke the
Schooner Shiloh of Province town 3 1/2 months
clean Shortened sail he heading to the N West
Ends Squally with rain Steering W by N
Lat by obs 34:34

Friday July the 26 first of this 24 hours Strong
breezes and Squally with rain Saw grain passers
at Sunset Shortened sail heading to the South
at 8 o'clock were Ship to the N W wind W S W
hull in the main sail and jib close reefed the
fore topsail took in the fore sail have too under
Short sail heading N W Ends with strong
gales from N S W and very ragged

Saturday July the 27 All these 24 hours
strong gales from the S W lying to under
Storm sails heading to the Northward and
Westward at 10 o'clock saw a Ship to the
S W of us under Short sail Lat by obs 35:31
Long 45:15

Sunday July the 28 Commences with fresh
gales from the S W and Squally with rain
middle part the same at 8 o'clock were Ship
to the Southward Set the fore sail ends
the same Lat by obs 35:50
Long in 45:25

Monday July the 29 first of these 24 hours
fresh gales from the South west lying to heading
to the Southward and Eastward Middle part
the same at 14 o'clock the wind shifted to the
North East more moderate made sail Steering
W S W Ends with fresh breezes and
and Squally with incessant rain some
thunder
