

Remarks Continued on "Board the Brig"
Wednesday Sept the 4 Commences with fresh
breezes from S.W. and ruggid saw the Islands
of St George and Sica at Sunset here too
under the East end of Papall at daylight
made all sail and ran down the North Side
of St Georges saw "black fish" cow fish and
porpoises ends ruggid and Squally wind S.W.

Thursday Sept the 5 Commences with fresh
breezes from S.W. and Squally rainy downy
for Geneva at 5 & M S. spoke and Banded the
Brig of Spruce for the Shortened Sail Lay
day off and on the Island of Geneva at night
at daylight Steered of South Squally with rain
7 sails in sight ends with fresh breezes
from West and ruggid Steering South

Friday Sept 6 first part fresh breezes from
the Westward and Squally Cruising of the W.C.
of Geneva at Sunset Shortened Sail the Island
bearing S.W. at daylight made Sail Standing
on either tack of Geneva 6 sails in sight
ends the same Squally with rain

Saturday Sept the 7 Commences with fresh
breezes and ruggid and Squally Steering South
at Sunset Shortened Sail heading to the S.E. at
daylight made Sail Steering by the wind S.E. by S
at 10 & M made the Island of St Michael
bearing S.E. run down into the Bay 5 sails in
sight ends with fresh breezes and pleasant
saw cow fish and porpoises so ends

Sunday Sept the 8 fresh winds from the
Southward and Westward and foggy downy
Cruising of St Michael Bay 3 Ships in sight
at Sunset Shortened Sail and here too in the Bay
middle part rainy and moderate wind S.E.
ends with moderate breezes from East
with incessant rain west end off St Michael
bearing West saw one sail Steering W.C. by W.

Monday Sept the 9 Commences with moderate winds
from S.E. to East heading to the Northward at 4 & M
made Sail and run off West to clear the Island
at 8 & M here to heading to the North and West
at 11 & M the wind shifted to the E.W. at day-
light made Sail and run of South St Michael
bearing S.E. ends fine weather wind wags
running down the South Side of St Michael

Tuesday Sept the 10 1850 Commences with moderate
breezes from N.W. and fine weather running down
for St Marys at Sunset have to St Marys bearing
S.W. 3 leagues at 2 & M heavy showers of rain
very heavy thunder and sharp lightning at daylight made
all sail and Steered of South wind N.W. ends fine
weather Cruising of the S.E. of St Marys Island 2 Ships
in sight all hands employed in breaking out and
standing fresh water aft and filling up with salt water
so the times go

Wednesday Sept the 11 Commences with moderate winds
from the Southward and Eastward Cruising of to the
Eastward of St Marys 5 sails in sight at Sunset
Shortened Sail at daylight calm at 5 & M light
winds from S.W. Steered of S.E. all hands employed
letting up rigging ends the same 6 sails in sight

Thursday Sept the 12 All these 24 hours fresh
breezes from W.S.W. and Cloudy weather
Steering by the wind South saw 3 Ships Steering
S.E. saw porpoises and grampuses No old

Friday Sept the 13 Commences with fresh breezes from
Westward and Squally with rain Steering S by West at
Sunset Shortened Sail heading to the Southward
at daylight made Sail Steering S by West ends with
fine breezes from West and pleasant weather
Lat 34:08 Long 22:25

Saturday Sept the 14 All these 24 hours moderate
breezes from the W.W. and pleasant weather
Steering S.E. and S.E. saw three whale Ships
Steering South unbent the old main sail and
bent the new one so ends this 24 hours
Lat in 33:01 Long 21:50:30

Sunday Sept the 15 Commences with moderate
breezes from N.W. Steering S.E. at Sunset
Shortened Sail Steering S.E.
middle and latter part moderate wind from N.W.
here too heading to the N.W. saw a Brig Steering to the
Northward and Westward Lat 32 37 Long 20 10
