

Ship Mexican Days 1874 in 1880

Feb 13th Fine weather and pleasant sail set
Saw some fine birds off our weather bow. At
night we backed ship and took in sail.
The old man turning betraying him so once the

Feb 14th Fine weather and pleasant all sail set we
" " Taced ship At night Latitude 20.5 North of the
" " Equator so Dec. this 24 hours with no fish 1830

18th Fine weather and pleasant all sail set the
" " Captain turning from the harbor employed in ship
Duty latitude 2° 2' so ended this 24 hours 1830

Feb 10th " " Fine weather and pleasant all suit set. and thence the flying job the Captain turning 9° Perote and marter. so ends this 24 hours in 1830

Feb 17th 1830
Fine weather and pleasant all sail set
We saw a school of whales off our starboard bow
We lowered our boats, and the starboard boat
struck one and killed her, the Larboard boat
struck another but she got loose from them
and whale went down and came up to the
windward. we pulled on the starboard

And Captain Fisher killed her with the iron
or Harpoon and there was no blubber in the whale
So the Captain called it his whale And we got
them made fast to the ship And took in sail



Feb. Fine weather and subsistent will sail out we cut
 18th out our whales and began for to try out the Belubbin
 " " These was whales seen from mast head but they
 was finn backs and at night we ticked ship

Feb 19th We finished tying out our Little Fish. and Off
" " Toward night we saw great many fine Bucks
" " The Old man had a quantity of Cloth on Deck 18

Feb. 20th Fine weather and pleasant all sail set the
Coopers cooping oil and making yards to the
Captain turning Belaying pins and it was his
Birth Day. he gave us all some grog. but Little
One the steward killed the Little pig for us

Feb Fine weather and pleasant all sail set wd
21st Sun N Breeze off our weather beam towards
" " " " " " " " " " " "
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These 24 hours Commenced with A Strong Breeze
We spoke the ship Barkley of New Bedford
And there was another ship in sight of us.
Butter of the 24 hours foggy and little mist
All of hands employed in stowing down our sails

23 Commences with calm weather latter part
" " Squally, and rainy, except the mizen top sail to
Deck Mene and the fore mast. A turning shower pins
