

Ship Mexican Days Weeks 1830

March 5th
 When we was leaving in our Whales, the Captain told Manuel De Susan to Sing out, he said he did not know how, the Captain hutch up the flying jib by the sides and struck him with it twice or three. The munnels took it Handspike and was it going to hit him with it when the Captain struck them with it over the Head, and he did bleed most dreadfully. He then took him aft and was going to raise him up in the rigging, and we all went aft and said, do you going to kill him or what he you going to do, and we did take him down into the Cabin, and bound his Head up and so into these 24 hours with Bud Vorage in 1830



March 6th
 Saturday
 We called Mr Thomas by Daylight and found our other whale and P.M. Tucker ship. The John Butler Fisher with himself with A side Boy, but on his feet, we into this 24 Hours

March 7th
 Sunday
 Fine weather and pleasant All hands to work at trying out, the Captain give us A Sea pig To stuff in up with soft soap, we finished trying, set it at midnight, so into this 24 Hours

March 8th
 Monday
 Commenced with fine weather and pleasant All sails set, we took out the after hatch Way for bread and molasses and meat, we squared away our yards, and steered N. by W. and so into this 24 Hours in 1830.

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March 9th
 Tuesday
 Fine weather and pleasant, all sails set The Captain fixing the wheel and tiller A.M. Hoisted the topgallant sails, and hauled up the fore sail, and fixed the jib, so into the 24

March 10th
 Wednesday
 Fine weather and pleasant, all sails set P.M. About the main topgallant sail, De suspension The topgallant Course, A.M. P.M. N. and by W. Latitude 20 North And so into with good times

March 11th
 Thursday
 Commenced with light Breeze so P.M. Clearing The gear 7 o'clock took in sail and hauled up the courses, the mate being showing, Latitude 18 North

March 12th
 Friday
 We raised A School of whales off our weather bow bound to the leeward, we lowered our boats but it was A long time before we got past the Starboard boat killed one, and the Starboard boat killed 2 good whales, and the Starboard boat picked up the Dragger whale for 2118 P.M. The Starboard boat killed 2 of the good fish, and got all of them, but to the Starboard boat 10 o'clock



good fish it went you see

The whale was bound About N. 2. S. The whale Course, near S.W. and by South, when we raised the whale the Captain turning on his Day 1830
