

Oct 20th

We sent up the royal mast and yard and cleared up the decks so ends this 24 hours 18

Oct 21st

In Company with the Caledonia Raided the side of whales in the sun glade. P.M. hove away the Starboard boat struck one but only got one iron in the whales Sounded and we got hove from her. We only want one of them It is very hard getting I assure you so ends the 24

Oct 22nd

Commences with light winds starting So. and by west. All hands Doing ships duty the mate fixing the lower studding sails the other ships in sight of us At night altered Course South and by East. Do Squally so ends these 24 hours with little Rain. 1830

Oct 23rd

We made the land early in the morning we bent our cables to our Anchor. P.M. Sailed and P.M. double reefed our topsails and hauled close upon the wind. so ends these

Oct 24th

Commences with A Strong breeze of wind we made sail and runed into the harbour of Wexce. and there anchored. and furled our sails fore and aft. 1830

Oct 25th

Very fine weather and several ships in harbour for the crew went Ashore on Liberty

Oct 26th

Not much work going on in port this time but bringing off fruit from the shore

Oct 27th

Very pleasant weather and the Captains Commenced to land for our ship from the shore so ends this 24 hours 18

Oct 28th

Commences with A light breeze of wind and for the crew on shore on Liberty

Oct 29th

All hands employed in getting off fruit and goats. we had 4 days Liberty Ashore

Oct 30th

Very pleasant weather. P.M. we got under way and hove up our Anchor. in A few minutes we struck the blades very strong We reefed our topsails fore and aft 1830 Bound to Wexce to Cooper our oil. 1830

Oct 31st

Commences with A strong breeze of wind. we runed into the Harbour and there anchored. and furled our sails

Nov 1st

Very Pleasant weather. took in two ships inside the Harbour the Maria of Nantucket. the Russell of New Bedford. Several ships inside the Harbour and the Tarboe is off. so ends this 24 hours Henry Collins 1830
