17th A.M. we took in the waste boat
Windy, And put her over board. P.M. we
" " " raised a shoal of whales off our
weather, but we lowered 2 boats
but our luck was not spent when
they was Right whale so ends 24

18th Commences with light winds the crew
had a watch below the Carpenter
turning belaying pins so over 24.

19th Commenced with squally weather
 W. S. P. M. we reefed our topsails for a S.
 " " " And aft. the sun sets 45 minutes
 past 7 o'clock. midnight turned
 out the reefs out. so ends these
 24 hours with cold weather. there
 was a man sick but the Captain
 would not give him no physic. 1851
