Mon
19th Commences with A Strong Breeze
Sati of wind from the Northward. A M
" " " mending the main topgallant
sail. And Shanker. P M Bent the
Sails. And set up the Main topga
lant Back Stay and turned
out the reefes and cleared up
the Decks fore and aft. 1831.

Mar Commences with Light winds
20th Early in the morning we raised at
Tide off our weather bow. we backed
" " Our main topsail to the mast. And
She runed across our Stern and spoke
th it was A Spanish Schooner bound
With Cotton. bound to Bonaparte
A M we backed ship. And stood to
the Northward. so ends this 24 Hours

Mon
21st All hands to work fitting the
Rigging. A M sent up the fore
Woods skysail yard. and mizen. P M
" " " made spun yarn. And set up the
fore rigging so ends this 24. H Collins

Mon
22nd Light winds and pleasant. A M
Tues Making spun yarn and weaving
" " " A mat. And setting up fore rigging
- So ends with Pleasant. 1831. H C

Mon
23rd Took off the spun yarn off the fore
Woods And laced them down. Set up the
Stays And P M served the fore Swifter
And fitted the fore rigging. Do W
Evening A mat to graft with the
" " Captain Loring. H Collins
