

22 From New Bedford To the Western Islands
Friday July 25th 1851
First Part light breeze from the Northward
steering Eastward all sail set, at night took in
sail Middle Part calm latter Part moderate
breeze from the Westward steering SE the masts
employed some jammers & other parts
So Ends Lat 41-04 N
Long 73-23 W

23 Saturday July 26th 1851
First Part fresh breeze from the Westward
steering Different Course, then a ship steering
Westward at night took in sail & ahead the
shipping applicably to the crew, Middle Part
strong wind latter Part the same lashing
two under storm sails heading Northward
saw a Brig steering Northward So Ends
Lat 41-43 N
Long 73-38 W

24 Sunday July 27th 1851
First Part strong winds from West heading N by W
under storm sails at 5 o'clock began to moderate
Middle Part fresh breeze latter Part the same
made sail & steered SE Wind from the
Westward So Ends Lat 41-51 N
Long 74-48 W

25 Monday July 28th 1851
First Part moderate breeze from the Westward
steering SE by S fine pleasant weather with
quite a smooth sea, but no fish in
sight, but flying fish, and they are to quick
on the wing, Middle Part light air
latter Part the same steering SE by S all sail
set So Ends Lat 41-20 N
Long 75-39 W

26 Tuesday July 29th 1851
First Part moderate breeze from NW steering
SE by S all sail out at night took in sail &
lay by the wind heading Northward Middle Part
parted the straps to the fore peak & lashed
latter Part light air steering SE by S employed in
fitting at water traps weather fine So Ends
Lat 41-07 N
Long 76-54 W

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27 Towards the Western Islands
Wednesday July 30th 1851
First Part light air from the Westward steering
SE by S all sail set, the weather fine the water
employed at night took in sail Middle Part
light air latter Part the same steering SE by S all
sail set So Ends Lat 40-47 N
Long 77-00 W

28 Thursday July 31st 1851
First Part light breeze from the Westward steering
SE all sail set at night took in sail Middle
Part light air, latter Part the same saw the
Island of Larvo bearing by compass S by W Dist
50 miles saw a ship cutting & more sail in
sight saw Grompores So Ends
Lat 40-14 N
Long 78-37 W

29 Friday August 1st 1851
First Part Moderate breeze from the Westward
at 1 o'clock spoke the Barque North America
of New London Capt Mason one large whale
catching ship vesper in company, number of
other ships in sight, the land in sight
Carro & Flores, Middle Part moderate breeze
heading Westward under short sail latter Part
fresh breeze made sail wore ship in shore
number of ships in sight saw Grompores
So Ends

30 Saturday Aug 2nd 1851
First Part fresh breeze from the SE steering shore
new cloth in under Carro & wore ship heading
Westward took in the main sail Middle Part
quite moderate latter Part light wind north
of large swell on either side the land in sight
to the SE 65 miles Dist, at 10 o'clock spoke
the Schooner A. Nicholson of Providence for
Capt Carnal 64 months out 80 lbs. The
Capt came on Board & spent the day
stayed a long in company saw
Grompores So Ends

Long 81-28 W
Long 81-54 W
