First Part more moderate laying the Middle
Part strong breeze latter Part the same employed
in putting down Black straps to the fore mast
in the putting the fore sail. Wind from NW steering
NW by W So End Lat by obs 40-28 N
Long by Chron 32-13 W

Thursday Aug 14th 1851
First Part strong breeze from NW steering by
the wind NW by W the Watch employed Middle Part
fresh breeze latter Part strong wind took in sail
& have the head in NW So End
Lat by obs 41-28 N
Long by Chron 33-45 W

Friday Aug 15th 1851
First Part strong wind from the Westward
leading NW at night spoke the Barque
Spaniard of Providence Capt Cook 4 Months
out 100 lbs the Watch came on board
after latter Middle Part strong breeze latter
Part the same carried away the masts to the
jib they that went through the cutwater
just in it now over a black sail
leading NW by E Wind from NW
So End Lat by obs 42-05 N
Long by Chron 33-13 W

First Part strong breeze from NW steering NW
to the NW the Watch employed Middle Part
it moderated latter Part light wind & fine weather
all sail set leading NW nothing in sight
So End Lat by obs 41-30 N
Long by Chron 33-35 W

Sunday Aug 17th 1851
First Part light wind from the NW steering NW
different courses saw at night steering Eastward
Middle Part fresh breeze latter Part strong wind
from NW steering SE by E So End
Lat by obs 41-41 N
Long by Chron 32-51 W

Monday Aug 18th 1851
First Part strong wind from NW steering SE by E
at night shortened sail & lay by the wind all
night Middle Part strong breeze latter Part the
same steering by the wind SE So End
Lat by obs 41-25 N
Long by Chron 31-07 W

Tuesday Aug 19th 1851
First Part strong wind from NW steering SE
under short sail Middle Part strong wind changed
to the SE latter Part light wind & toppling
one sail in sight saw Grampons So End
Lat by obs 41-25 N
Long by Chron 31-07 W

Wednesday Aug 20th 1851
First Part light wind & toppling with fine weather
all sail out one sail in sight Middle Part
light wind & toppling latter Part the same the land
of Canoe in sight bearing NW distant 40 miles
So End Lat by obs 40-20 N
Long by Chron 30-45 W

Thursday Aug 21th 1851
First Part light breeze from NW steering by the wind
of Eastward a sail in sight Middle Part moderate
breeze latter Part fresh breeze from NW steering
by the wind to the Westward the land in sight
saw Grampons So End Lat by obs 40-08 N
Long by Chron 30-42 W
