First Part bark bears from the NW steering in
for the land at night run through between the
two Islands, Capt Gray came on Board, Middle
Part saw latter Part the same steering to the
SE the land in sight & number of sails
60 So End

Monday Sept 1st 1851
First Part bark bears from NW heading NE & S
at night took in sail latter Part made sail
& steered South one sail in sight steering Eastward
61 So End Lat by obs 38-18.5
Long by obs 28-18.5

Tuesday Sept 2nd 1851
First Part light winds from NW steering South
at 3 PM saw the Island of Pangel bearing NE
first 40 miles, Middle Part heard squalls of wind
& rain at 3 gave ship to the South latter Part
Calms 4 Islands in sight So End
Lat by obs 39-05.5
Long by obs 28-25.5

Wednesday Sept 3rd 1851
First Part light winds from NE steering Eastward
one Brig in sight the land 25 miles distant
Middle Part light winds latter Part bark bears
set all sail steering Eastward 3 sails in sight
& the land on both sides So End

Thursday Sept 4th 1851
First Part bark bears from NE steering ESE
all sail set, Middle Part moderate breeze latter
Part light winds & baffling steering along shore by the
Island of Ferreira 20 miles distant So End
64 No obs

Friday Sept 5th 1851
First Part light air & baffling, put on a new
flying jib stay & gyres at night took in sail
Middle Part calm latter Part light winds
from the South west steering Eastward the
land 8 miles distant number of sail in
sight So End

55 off St Michael

Saturday Sept 6th 1851
First Part light winds from the South west steering
Eastward at one PM spoke the Barque Propie
Wind Capt Stanton 42 months out Clear, at night
saw the Island of St Michael bearing SE by Compass
Middle Part fresh breeze latter Part the same
heading by the wind NE So End
65 No obs

Sunday Sept 7th 1851
First Part fresh breeze from SW heading SSE
the land 20 miles distant at night took in sail
Middle Part light winds latter Part Calms 2 sail
in sight the land 25 miles distant So End
66 No obs

Monday Sept 8th 1851
First Part Calms weather fine Middle Part the
same latter Part light air from SW the
land 25 miles distant saw grampuses, & other
flying fish So End
67

Tuesday Sept 9th 1851
First Part light air from the SW heading SSE
saw a Brig steering Northward, Middle Part
light winds latter Part the same wind from
the NE with rain heading in for the land
68 Saw grampuses So End

Wednesday Sept 10th 1851
First Part moderate breeze from NE with rain
heading in shore at 4 PM hauled time by the
wind to the SE & took in sail Middle Part
strong wind with rain latter Part squally squalls
sail & steered for the West End of the Island
at 10 PM spoke the schooner Walter H. of
Providence Town Capt Cook 42 months Clear
70 So End

Thursday Sept 11th 1851
First Part strong winds from ESE at 4 PM
took the West End of the Island saw a brig in
shore Middle Part bark bears latter Part the
same steering South west all sail set Part
at Peira of a large ship ahead
So End
Lat by obs 38-59.5
Long by obs 28-55.5
