

71 Trussing off the Island of St Mary  
Friday Sept 12<sup>th</sup> 1851  
First Part fresh breeze from ESE steering by the  
Wind S by E all sail set, Middle Part fine  
weather latter part the same set all sail  
at 8 o'clock took ship to the Eastward & sail  
in site So Ends  
Lat by obs 35-15 N  
Long by Chron 25-45 W

72 Saturday Sept 13<sup>th</sup> 1851  
First Part light winds from the SE heading ESE  
all sail out Middle Part spoke the schooner  
Walter R. the Boat came on board & got her  
letters latter Part fine weather set all sail  
saw the Island of St Mary bearing ESE by  
Compass & sail in site So Ends  
No obs

73 Sunday Sept 14<sup>th</sup> 1851  
First Part light winds from the South at 4 o'clock  
four breacher run for them saw them no more  
saw a large stick of Timber took it on  
board it was 48 feet long & 11 inches square  
latter Part fresh breeze, found the stick of  
Timber badly worm eaten gave for nothing  
hove it overboard again, at 11 o'clock came  
on squally with sharp lightning took in  
sail. heading Southward So Ends  
74 the land & St Mary's Part

Monday Sept 15<sup>th</sup> 1851  
First Part Moderate breeze from SW made  
sail at 3 o'clock were ship in sight, at  
5 o'clock Parted the main sheet block strap  
put on another, Middle Part light wind  
& sharp lightning to the Eastward latter  
Part light winds with squalls of rain  
Wind baffling steering in for the town of  
St Mary So Ends

75 Tuesday Sept 16<sup>th</sup> 1851  
First Part light winds & baffling at 3 o'clock  
I went on shore at dark time on board  
with a boat load of Potatoes & Onions, Middle  
Part steered Southward latter Part fresh breeze  
from the SW So Ends No obs

76 Wednesday Sept 17<sup>th</sup> 1851  
First Part fresh breeze from the NE steering  
Middle Part fresh breeze latter Part strong  
winds under double reef steering Eastward  
So Ends  
Lat by obs 35-46 N  
Long by Chron 24-46 W

77 Thursday Sept 18<sup>th</sup> 1851  
First Part strong winds from the North steering ESE  
at night took in sail Middle Part strong winds  
latter Part more moderate set double reefs &  
jib heading by the wind Part So Ends  
Lat by obs 35-42 N  
Long by Chron 22-17 W

78 Friday Sept 19<sup>th</sup> 1851  
First Part gentle moderate winds from S by E heading  
East, ordered the flying jib to repair it &  
lent it again, Middle Part some rain with  
sharp lightning, the wind shifted to the Eastward  
latter Part strong gale were ship to the SE  
saw 4 ships steering to the SW under all sail  
So Ends  
Lat by obs 35-43 N  
Long by Chron 23-55 W

79 Saturday Sept 20<sup>th</sup> 1851  
First Part strong gale from the Eastward with  
squalls of rain, Middle Part strong gale latter  
Part the same at 8 o'clock were ship to the  
North, hard squalls of rain wind from ESE  
So Ends  
Lat by obs 35-23 N  
Long by Chron 24-04 W

80 Sunday Sept 21<sup>st</sup> 1851  
First Part strong Gale from ESE laying two  
riders, Chart reef fore sail & main topsail  
at 5 o'clock were ship to the SE, Middle Part  
strong Gale latter Part the same laying two  
So Ends  
Lat by obs 34-57 N  
Long by Chron 24-11 W

81 Monday Sept 22<sup>nd</sup> 1851  
First Part strong Gale from ESE heading SE, a bad  
sea on, Middle Part strong Gale latter Part more  
moderate at 8 o'clock were ship to the North  
saw at 7 o'clock steering Westward So Ends  
Lat by obs 34-30 N  
Long by Chron 24-36 W
