Saturday Oct 25<sup>th</sup> 1851

First Part strong wind from NW heading NW at night took in sail Middle Part strong wind Latter Part quite moderate made sail & were ship came on specially split the jib took in sail & have two heading Westward So End

Lat by obs 32-00 N Long by thro 15-06-50 W

Sunday Oct 26<sup>th</sup> 1851

First Part strong wind from NW with squalls heading NW under Cloot reef Foresail Middle Part strong breeze Latter Part the same on board the jib & went it by sail for 4 jib sailing Westward So End

Lat by obs 32-20 N Long by thro 15-04 W

Monday Oct 27<sup>th</sup> 1851

First Part strong wind from NW at 3 P.M. was ship to the South Middle Part strong wind with rain, thunder & sharp light rain Latter Part strong gale So End

Lat by obs 32-14 N Long by thro 14-06 W

Tuesday Oct 28<sup>th</sup> 1851

First Part strong gale was ship to the Westward laying two Middle Part strong gale Latter Part more moderate employed in the jib So End

Lat by obs 32-49 N Long by thro 14-27 W

Wednesday Oct 29<sup>th</sup> 1851

First Part fresh breeze from NW with the 01 large swell on, finished the jib at 3 P.M. but it Middle Part wind quite like Latter Part fresh breeze was ship to the Westward & set the jib So End

Lat by obs 32-58 N Long by thro 14-30 W

Thursday Oct 30<sup>th</sup> 1851

First Part fresh breeze from NW at night saw a ship & a brig steering Southward Middle Part fresh breeze Latter Part rainy heading S by W So End

Lat by obs 32-18 N Long by thro 13-55 W

Friday Oct 31 1851

First Part fresh breeze from NW heading S by W at 3 P.M. saw two large Whales from off Deck with Allen at Mast head lowered the Chute the Whales was making to the Windward could not come up with them it being very reef, gave up the Chute & came on board saw a ship on steering Southward Middle Part strong wind with rain squalls Latter Part with breeze from the South blowing from the Westward were ship to the NW by the jib So End

Lat by obs 32-25 N Long by thro 13-47 W

Saturday Nov 1 1851

First Part fresh gale from the South laying the under steam sails Middle Part more moderate Latter Part fresh breeze made more sail heading NW So End

Lat by obs 32-15 N Long by thro 14-35 W

Sunday Nov 2 1851

First Part fresh breeze from SW at 2 P.M. was ship to the SE saw a ship steering Westward Middle Part strong wind Latter Part the same steering S by E So End

Lat by obs 31-37 N Long by thro 14-18-30 W

Monday Nov 3 1851

First Part fresh breeze from East steering NE Middle Part lay by the wind Latter Part quite moderate made sail & steered South So End

Lat by obs 30-33 N Long by thro 13-55 W

Tuesday Nov 4 1851

First Part light breeze from the Eastward with a large swell on steering S by E Middle Part fine Latter Part the same steered South with sail set at 10 P.M. saw a school of Whales formed & struck on board tow 4 minutes to the fore drew out a whale & the crew on board & chaste with the schooner So End

Lat by obs 29-45 N Long by thro
