First Part moderate breeze from SW with  
some rain bearing off shore to the Southward  
stead down the side, at night took in sail  
& have the heading Eastward Middle Part  
strong wind from SE latter Part the same  
the land in sight So End Dist 30 miles  
Long by Chron 14. 47 M

Sunday Nov 30<sup>th</sup> 1851

First Part strong breeze from SE heading East  
Set the jib, Middle Part light wind  
in changeable weather latter Part fresh breeze  
from the SE were ship to the Westward  
So End Dist by obs 30-21 M

So End Dist by obs 29-38
