First Part light wind from NE heading Northward Middle Part light air saw 1 black fish round the ship latter Part light air from SE with fine weather the land 15 miles distant. Whales, we can see the towers on shore 193 So Ends

Monday Jan 12th 1852

First Part light air from the SE heading Along shore Eastward Middle Part light air & blowing latter Part the same the land 15 miles distant So Ends

Tuesday Jan 13th 1852

First Part light air from the Southward saw black bit house & struck all three boats West & Starboard from the front & got one Middle Part light air latter Part calm 16 miles from land So Ends

Wednesday Jan 14th 1852

First Part light air from the Eastward Middle Part the same with a large swell from the SE latter Part fresh breeze run close in shore saw nothing taken ship off shore So Ends

Long by the same 14-44 1/2

Thursday Jan 15th 1852

First Part fresh breeze from E & NE heading NW Middle Part strong breezes at & latter ship in shore latter Part strong trades the land in sight bearing Westward, sailed out the Blackfish So Ends

Friday Jan 18th 1852

First Part strong trades from SE heading NE at night saw beaches Middle Part light air latter Part the same on the SE side of the island steering for the passage between the two islands So Ends

Saturday Jan 17th 1852

First Part light air from the SE at night Part the West end of Lanzarote Island Middle Part Moderate breezes with some fog & heavy dew latter Part fresh breeze from East run close in shore So Ends

Sunday Jan 18th 1852

First Part light wind from SE run close in under Cooks bluffs Middle Part light breeze latter Part fresh breeze from SE steering E & S by S So Ends

the 34 miles to far West Long by the same 15-50 1/2

Monday Jan 19th 1852

First Part light breeze from the Eastward heading in shore Middle Part light wind latter Part the same the weather fine & clear saw it fin back & Jaspers So Ends

Tuesday Jan 20th 1852

First Part light wind from the Eastward at one fell I went in shore to try for fish could not find any went on shore in landing I got swamped in the surf got three West on shore & got the water out of her & took at good time and got off safe, at 4 fell got on board Middle Part Moderate breezes latter Part fresh breeze from SE heading off shore the land in sight So Ends

Wednesday Jan 21st 1852

First Part fresh breeze from SE heading in shore at 3 fell taken off the Middle Part fresh breeze from the SE & squally latter Part strong wind & squally Part off before the wind & run down along shore & W the land from 10 to 15 miles distant So Ends
