Wednesday July 7th 1852
First Part moderate breeze from the Westward
with squalls of rain, strong Southward from
Porpoise & Cowfish, Middle Part Calm
Latter Part fresh breeze from the Westward
heading Southward rain to ends

29 Thursday July 8th
First Part light wind with rain heading
Southward, at night took in sail
Middle Part strong wind with rain
Latter Part moderate breeze from S.E.
steering South specially

30 Friday July 9th
First Part Calm with large swell
on Middle Part light air with rain
Latter Part strong wind from the Westward
heading S.E. to ends

31 Saturday July 10th
First Part strong wind from West W. by N
two hours at 11 AM ship steers Eastward
Middle Part fresh breeze latter Part
quite moderate made a 3 sail heading
S.E. Wind from S.W. to ends

32 Sunday July 11th
First Part fresh breeze from S.W.
heading S.E. at night took in sail
Middle Part moderate breeze latter
Part the same heading South
to ends

Monday July 12th
First Part light wind from West W. heading
South, Middle Part Calm latter Part
light air from the S.W. with fine weather
Employed in repairing the charts
Saw porpoises
to ends

New Jan thinking of going to sea

34 Cruising in the Long of 45 West
Tuesday July 13th 1852

First Part light air from S.E. steering S.W.
at night took in sail Middle Part
light air latter Part moderate breeze from
the S.E. made all sail & steered different
courses saw plenty of porpoises
to ends

35 Wednesday July 14th
First Part fine weather the wind from
S.E. steering S.E. at night took in sail
Middle Part moderate breeze latter Part the
same made sail saw a large strain
Southward, at 10 o'clock spoke the Bark
Winthrop of Fair Haven 11 tons out 30 6th
Sperdy Capt Woodard came on board and
got some late papers to ends

36 Thursday July 15th
First Part moderate breeze from S.E. steering
Southward, saw Porpoise & Cowfish, Middle
Part by 11 latter Part fine weather set
all sail to take ship to the Westward
saw pinbacks wind from the Eastward
to ends

37 Friday July 16th
First Part fine weather at 6 o'clock saw
blonde fish lowered to Charles Coule put
stake came on board to take in
sail, Middle Part light air latter Part
the same heading South to ends

38 Saturday July 17th
First Part light breeze from the Eastward
heading S.W. at 3 o'clock saw blonde fish
lowered to Charles Coule, not struck
came on board, at 10 o'clock took in
sail Middle Part light wind
latter Part the same set all sail
heading to the S.E. the 12 to 2
employed in getting rigging to ends

39 Sunday July 18th
Fine weather and S.E. breeze 10 knots
shall we do, New Jan thinking
of home
