Wednesday Sept 29th 1852
First Part calm the land to the
East. Saw 14 schools of black porpoise
part light airs from the latter part
fresh breeze from the steering S by E
the land to the distance

112 Thursday Sept 30th
First Part strong breeze from the
southern by the Middle Part moderate
breeze from the land to the distance
the strong gale with some squalls
of rain & latter part quite moderate
with a head swell on steering S by E
So Ends Lat by obs 35-20 N
Long by the 23-24 W

113 Friday Oct 1st
First Part moderate breeze from West
steering South, under short sail, at large
swell on Middle Part light breeze
from the West latter part strong wind
saw 17 schools of whales landed and
charter they saw the vessel give up
the chase & came on board & steered
to the westward So Ends Lat by obs 35-24 N
Long by the 23-23 1/2 W

114 Saturday Oct 2nd
First Part strong wind from East heading
by the wind S by E. Saw 14 schools
steering Westward, at night took in
sail Middle Part light wind split
the fore sail latter part light wind saw
14 large whale landed & charter started
at nine did not part on board
& charter with the vessel So Ends
Lat by obs 35-40 N

115 Sunday Oct 3rd
First Part moderate breeze from the
SE. Boat of new Presail, at 4 P.M. lowered
& saw 14 whales at sunset got up to a large
whale & shot it & bomb lance cut him
it came on deck saw him no more came
& took in sail Middle Part fine weather
with light baffling wind steering S by E
Coursed took for a sea of whales
find nothing So Ends Lat by obs 35-04 N
Long by the 22-54 W

116 Cruising On the Steam General
Monday Oct 4th 1852
First Part light wind from the northward
heading Westward Middle Part light air
latter part both breezes from West at 8 o'clock
spoke the Brig cutter of Providence Town
4 months out of date. number of amure sail
in sight So Ends Lat by obs 35-38 N
Long by the 22-37 W

117 Tuesday Oct 5th
First Part moderate breeze steering Eastward
at 4 P.M. saw black porpoise lowered & chased
with great success, at night took in sail
Middle Part light wind latter part the same
but all sail or steam to the South were
So Ends Lat by obs 35-41 N
Long by the 22-58 W

118 Wednesday Oct 6th
First Part fine breeze from West steering
Southward all sail out Middle Part fine
latter part the same saw 14 schools steering
Westward So Ends Lat by obs 34-54 N
Long by the 20-51 W

119 Thursday Oct 7th
First Part brisk breeze from West of the
steering South at night took in sail
latter part fresh breeze & fine weather
made sail to steam to the West Southward
& sail in sight So Ends Lat by obs 34-08 N
Long by the 19-55 W

120 Friday Oct 8th
First Part fresh breeze from West of the
steering Middle Part run under fore sail
latter part fresh breeze made sail at
10 o'clock saw the Island of Etadecree bearing
by compass N by E Dist 60 miles one fell
in sight So Ends Lat by obs 33-18 N
Long by the 17-51 W

121 Saturday Oct 9th
First Part fresh breeze from West steering
for the land Middle Part by latter part
strong wind run down off of French Hall
and went on shore, number of vessels
sailing at anchor. & whales in sight
So Ends
