Let in by log 33.20 or Long in by Chronomet. 40.20 West

22 Remarks on Thursday Oct 30<sup>th</sup> 1845  
These 24 hours begins with fresh breeze from S.W. & hazy weather Steering E. & S. watch employed in ships duty fit & make gale ground hoists & put up an onion rack in the Message & put up 1 bushel of onions at 11 AM took in main top gallant sail at 8 o'clock topsails set & 9 o'clock topsails middle & latter part of the day moderate gale from the equality & ruggid sea on at 7 AM Steered E. & S.W. at 11 o'clock on ruggid sea & Let in by log 34.00 or Long in by Chronomet. 37.08 West

23 Remarks on Friday Oct 31<sup>st</sup> 1845  
These 24 hours begins with strong winds from the equality & very ruggid at 10 AM hauled off 18. N.E. under all sail red topsails & red foresail at 1. AM A began to rain at 2 turned red out the barsail at 8 got all sail on but saw one barque off weather growth Steering to the N.W. by the wind the day ends with a fine breeze & hazy weather Steering N.E.  
Let in by log 33.17 or Long in by Chronomet. 34.10 West

24 Remarks on Saturday November 1<sup>st</sup> 1845  
These 24 hours begins with moderate breeze from N.W. & hazy weather under all sail Steering N.E. watch employed in ships duty middle & latter part of the day fine breeze & passing showers of rain at 4 AM Steered N.E. & S. watch employed in fitting the waist boat for whaling & other various kinds of work on board at Messen there N.E. & S. ends the day  
Let in by log 32.44 or Long in by Chronomet. 31.15 West

25 Remarks on Sunday November 2<sup>nd</sup> 1845  
These 24 hours begins with a fine breeze from N.W. Steering N.E. watch employed in ships duty at 3 PM the wine hall on in a gale & began to rain at 5 hauled up middle & latter part of the day fine breeze & passing squalls of rain at 5 AM the wine hall returned to the N.E. Steering N.E. & S. the day ends with fair & fresh breeze from N.E.  
Let in by log 31.49 or Long in by Watch Chronomet. 29.47 West

26 Remarks on Monday November 3<sup>rd</sup> 1845  
These 24 hours begins with fresh breeze from N.E. & S. under all sail Steering by the wine heading up N.E. & S. at 6 PM ruggid topsails middle & latter part of the day fresh breeze from N.E. & S. & passing squalls at 8 AM turned out the rips at 10 put them in a gun watch employed in ships duty sent down the main top gallant gear & made new parcel rope & put on new footropes & made the day ends with breeze & passing clouds Steered N.E.  
Let in by log 30.17 or Long in by Chronomet. 26.15 West

27 Remarks on Tuesday November 4<sup>th</sup> 1845  
These 24 hours begins with fresh breeze from N.E. & S. & cloudy weather Steering N.E. watch employed in fitting the main top gallant gear at 5 AM set up middle & latter part of the day strong N.E. trade & ruggid sea on & passing showers of rain watch employed in fitting futer throves the day ends strong breeze  
Let in by log 29.35 or Long in by Watch 21.10 West

28 Remarks on Wednesday November 5<sup>th</sup> 1845  
These 24 hours begins with strong N.E. trade & ruggid & passing showers of rain Steering N.E. watch employed in ships duty at 3 PM double red topsails put down main top gallant & a heavy squall on at 4 PM Steered N.E. & S. latter part of the day light winds from the N.W. & fine pleasant weather at 3 AM turned out rips & set main top gallant sail the day ends light winds & fine weather  
Let in by log 28.10 or Long in by Chronomet. 22.30 West

29 Remarks on Thursday November 6<sup>th</sup> 1845  
These 24 hours begins with light winds from the north & fine weather Steering N.E. & S. watch employed in ships duty sent up the fore top gallant mast & gear at 3 AM Steered N.E. middle & latter part of the day light winds & fine pleasant weather watch employed about the rigging put the waist boat out on her crains the day ends light winds from the N.W. & fine weather  
Let in by log 27.20 or Long in by Watch 21.42 West
