

89 Remarks on Monday January 5th 1846

These 24 hours begins with a fine breeze from East & passing clouds under all sail during which by the wind at 2 knots. Ship at sun down shot one shot & were ship to the NE & Middle & latter part of the day fine breeze & passing clouds at 12 were ship to the NE at 5 at 10 made sail & took to the NE & saw the Franklin & by watch employed in this duty turn on the crew cutting, fell & got out flour & molasses & other various kinds of work at Missioner track. Ship to the NE & the back to run off to the westward.

Left in by 17.30 & long in by Chronometer 36.15 West

90 Remarks on Tuesday January 6th 1846

These 24 hours begins with a fine breeze from E & NW & passing clouds under all sail during by the wind to the NE watch employed in this duty gunning, minding, minding, minding & boarding, minding & other various kinds of work on board at sun down shot one shot & were ship to the NE & Middle & latter part of the day, equally by Middle & some rain at 5 at 10 made sail & then by the wind to the NE & watch employed in this duty saw the Franklin & Barkley the day ends fair weather took ship to the NE with the boat.

Left in by 17.29 & long in by Chronometer 36.35 West

91 Remarks on Wednesday January 7th 1846

These 24 hours begins with a fine breeze from E & NW & some equally passing round under all sail during to the NE by the wind watch employed in this duty at sun down shot one shot & were ship to the NE & Middle & latter part of the day moderate breeze & fine weather at 2 at 10 were ship to the NE at 5 made sail saw one shot during to the NE watch employed in this duty making bungs & point patches for the fore top sail at 3 put Missioner track ship to the NE.

Left in by 17.30 & long in by Chronometer 36.10 West

92 Remarks on Thursday January 8th 1846

These 24 hours begins with light winds & fine pleasant weather during 10 at 10 one shot in light watch employed in breaking out the blue room after fore top sail & head & bent the top sail at 5 PM the Franklin off us & i went on board at sun down shot one shot & were ship to the NE & Middle & latter part of the day fine breeze & passing clouds at 3 at 10 were ship to the NE at 5 made sail saw the Franklin saw some birds on watch employed in minding the fore top sail at Missioner track ship to the NE so ends this day.

Left in by 17.33 & long in by Chronometer 36.23 West

93 Remarks on Friday January 9th 1846

These 24 hours begins with moderate breeze & fine weather during 10 at 10 watch employed in minding the fore top sail at sun down shot one shot & were ship to the NE & Middle & latter part of the day fine breeze & passing clouds at 5 at 10 were ship to the NE & Middle & were ship at 2 commenced repairing the fore top sail at 11 saw two birds one of them was the Franklin at Missioner track ship to the NE.

Left in by 17.42 & long in by Chronometer 36.23 West

94 Remarks on Saturday January 10th 1846

These 24 hours begins with moderate breeze from E & NW & fine weather during by the wind to the NE watch employed in minding the fore top sail at 1 PM fixed it & put it in the east saw plenty of fowls at sun down shot one shot & were ship to the NE at 5 made sail latter part of the day fine weather at 10 at 10 made sail at 11 saw two birds the day ends fine weather.

Left in by 17.55 & long in by Chronometer 36.50 West

95 Remarks on Sunday January 11th 1846

These 24 hours begins with moderate breeze & fine weather during first watch employed in washing there close the Franklin & one more whale vessel in sight to windward & one of them running for us supposed to be the barclay at 1 PM i left for him at 2 PM the barclay there us & i went on board & left him here to best head of wood at sun down shot one shot & were ship to the NE at 5 made sail saw one shot during to the NE at 10 were ship to the NE at 5 made sail saw two birds at Missioner track ship to the NE so ends this day.

Left in by 17.13 & long in by Chronometer 36.15 West

96 Remarks on Monday January 12th 1846

These 24 hours begins with light winds & fine weather during to the NE by the wind two whales in sight at 10 at 10 were ship to the NE at 5 made sail watch employed in this duty coiled the black fish line the Franklin off our beam during to the NE the day ends with moderate breeze.
