

104 Remarks on Tuesday January 20<sup>th</sup> 1846

These 24 hours begins with a fine breeze & passing clouds steering to the North by the wind at 1 PM finished boiling & turned up 112 lbs of blubber out at 2 PM I went on board of the fisher-boat & got some blubber & brought it on board & boiled it in & out it up steering to the Eastward at sun down Northward sail & let the watch at 7 PM made at five & commenced boiling every middle & latter part of the day fresh breeze & ruggid at 12 noon ship to the S. & W. at 8 PM finished boiling & washed off decks the day ends with a fresh breeze the fisher-boat off our lee beam boiling  
Let in by log 18.35 & Long in by Chronometer 36.57 West

105 Remarks on Wednesday January 21<sup>st</sup> 1846

These 24 hours begins with a fresh breeze from ESE & passing clouds steering by the wind to the Eastward double reef topsails 7/16 & try sail watch employed in making head drops the fisher-boat off our lee quarter steering the same boiling & one laborer to leeward at 3 AM were ship to the S. & E. & made sail at 5 PM I went on board & got 5 PM lbs of oil & turned it on board pumped out the oil & sent the cork back Northward sail & steered to the S. & E. by the wind latter part of the day moderate breeze & cloudy weather at 5 PM were ship to the S. & W. & made sail & began to break out the hole to show down our oil all hands employed the fisher-boat off our lee beam steering to the Eastward at midday got all the oil down & turned ship to the Eastward to end this day  
Let in by log 16.30 & Long in by Account 36.15 West

106 Remarks on Thursday January 22<sup>nd</sup> 1846

These 24 hours begins with light winds from ESE & cloudy weather steering by the wind to the Eastward all hands employed in moving off the hole at 3 PM finished moving & washed off decks saw the fisher-boat off our lee beam at sun down Northward sail latter part of the day moderate breeze & fine weather at 5 PM made all sail & were ship to the S. & W. at 8 PM saw a large whale off our lee bow going S. W. the fisher-boat off our lee quarter steering to the Eastward by the wind at 7 PM saw two more whales off our weather bow going S. W. at 8 PM sent 7 toward the boats for the lee whale & threw him to the leeward boat & killed him to the Starboard boat at midday took him at long side & got ready for cutting to end this day  
Let in by log 18.15 & Long 36.30 West by log & Dr

107 Remarks on Friday January 23<sup>rd</sup> 1846

These 24 hours begins with light winds & fine weather all hands employed in getting ready for cutting in our whale at 2 PM hooked on to him at sun down got his head cut off but a few flukes & left off & let the watch 3 watches at 4 PM sent 11 at 11 o'clock all hands & commenced cutting off the head by 12 hours & calms & fine smooth weather the day ends the same all hands employed in cutting off the junk & heaving it up  
Let in by log 18.50 & Long in by Chronometer 36.20 West

108 Remarks on Saturday January 24<sup>th</sup> 1846

These 24 hours begins with light winds & calms & fine weather & smooth sea all hands employed in cutting off the junk & boiling the case at 5 PM took in the head skin & made at five & commenced boiling head & getting down the tacks & clearing up & getting ready for cutting junk let the fore sail & fore top sail double reefed & steered by the wind to the S. & W. by 12 hours at 7 PM the watch middle & latter part of the day light breeze & fine weather all hands employed in cutting up junk & boiling at 9 PM finished cutting junk saw one sail the day ends boiling  
Let in by log 18.15 & Long in by Chronometer 36.21 West

109 Remarks on Sunday January 25<sup>th</sup> 1846

These 24 hours begins with moderate breeze from S. & E. all hands employed in boiling head at 1 PM had one squall of rain at 3 PM a brilliant big squall as land to this S. & E. breeze at 4 PM finished the head & commenced boiling every having to the S. & W. under short sail at 7 PM squally & rising attended with thunder & lightning by 11 PM was met at heavy shower of rain at 8 PM saw one sail at 8 PM took at heavy shower & rain & wind attended with thunder & lightning put on coverd cover at 9 PM made at fine again moderate breeze & cloudy weather all hands employed in cutting blubber & boiling the day ends the same  
Let in by log 18.30 & Long in by Dr 36.35 West

110 Remarks on Monday January 26<sup>th</sup> 1846

These 24 hours begins with moderate breeze from ESE & cloudy weather all hands employed in cutting up blubber & boiling at 4 PM finished cutting the blubber at 5 PM were ship to the S. & E. under short sail latter part of the day moderate breeze & overcast weather at 8 PM finished boiling & washed off decks saw several sails in sight the day ends moderate  
Let in by log 18.10 & Long in by Chronometer 36.13 West
