

190 Remarks on Thursday April 18th 1848

these 24 hours begins with moderate breeze from SE & cloudy weather - barometer begins in light water empty. Ship's duty at 1 PM stand on in the eve the barometer to windward morning by the wine to the ship in for the land at 6 PM new fresh & squalls of wind rain attended with thunder & lightning continued till at 9 PM the wine breeze from SE stand on in the eve at 10 stand on in the eve by the wine latter part of the day moderate wind from SE & cloudy at daylight make all sail & stand to the east for the barometer in light water empty. Ship's duty at 2 past 9 AM have them whole bearing West & going SE at signal for barometer at 11 AM toward boats for the whole & they were going quick to windward it being squally came on board & stand south by the wine in for the land it being 10 miles off to know this day left in 27.11 in. long 52.72.00

191 Remarks on Pricey April 17th 1846

these 24 hours begins with moderate breeze from E & E & cloudy weather, whales in sight to windward the land being 2 miles off leave the breakers on the north at 2 PM continued for the whales in company with the barqueley & saw saw nothing more of them they went out sight to windward at 4 PM came on board & Stearns on the E & I went on board the barqueley at 8 PM came on board at sun down Shortland Sail Stearns at 1 1/2 E the land in sight 16 miles off at sun down middle & Latter part of the day strong winds from East to E & E & a rugged sea on & thick weather at 9 PM took in jib & kept out at 10 PM Stearns on the E the barqueley off on weather low at 11 PM Stearns took in the fore top sail & Stearns by the wind blowing up the E & at 12 in 4 00 20.23 in long in 3 chronometer 70.10 mist

then 24 hours before with strong winds from S.E. & thick weather
 & heavy sea on morning by the wind heading N.E. & E. & the clearing off our weather beam during the same at 1 P.M.
 we close reefed the topsail & set it & close reefed the main to secure
 save one stang sail off our lee bow during the same at 4 P.M.
 we reefed the foresail & took in the waist boat blowing strong
 rough sea & thick weather & raining at 9 P.M. began to moderate
 at daylight were hit by the south & made all necessary sail & stuns by the
 wind heading south rough & sails in light we put the waist boat out
 water empty & in evening the clear & dry moderate wind
 set in 9.00 20.32 at long in 9.40.00 mer 70.00 West

193 Remarks on Sunday April 19th 1848

There 24 hours begins with moderate winds from E & S by S & cloudy weather steering South by the wind watch empty in working there close the base lay to windward & one M D brig & one whole brig off our lee quarter all steering to the South by the wind at 8 PM we spoke the brig Pavilion of Whitcomb capt Adams & went out 50 lbs. I went on board at 8 came back & shot and bait began to rain at 8 PM at 10 PM was ship to the S. E. Latter part of the day ~~the~~ very fine breeze & cloudy at day light made sail & steered by the wind to the South saw several birds in light the day ends fair weather the bar lay off our weather beam

Set in by 06 20.11 or by in by Chromometer 20.20 next

194 Remarks on Broriley April 20th 1848

Apr 24 hours begin with moderate breeze from SE & fair weather
 under all sail Steaming S.W. by W. since the land lay off our weather
 from Steaming to land saw some fish banks at 3 PM. Toward
 after blackfish & got 3 too to Harland boat the barclay came
 down & I went on board of her at ten down we started off from
 the bank broad up about 6 Northward sail at 2 PM I came on
 board light winds & good weather. Latter part of the day strong
 winds from E & E & ruffled & blowing clouds at 5 AM. In noon
 sail & commenced picking our blackfish & got him overboard
 saw the Dr. party in fish to windward at 10 refilled topcoils at 11
 took in 3 lb & 1/2 lb & 1/2 lb & 1/2 lb & 1/2 lb & 1/2 lb & 1/2 lb
 to cover this day barclay off our weather. quartered during the same
 left in by ab 28.39 at long in by Chronometer 70.30 M.S.T



195 Remarks on Powsley April 21st 1846

these 24 hours begins with strong breeze from E. at 8 & having a wind
& rough sea uneasy but clearing by the wind to the South
west is employed in mending our blackfish blubber the barrel
off our weather beam during the same week & latter part of the
day fresh breeze & rough sea at 4 past 40 PM wear ship to the S. E
at day light breeze fair. saw the 3 barken off our weather beam during
the same P. M. by the wind at 8 at 6 we made a fire & commenced
boiling out our blackfish the day more rough & bartering steam
set in by 20. 29 at Long. in by Chronometer 70. 30 West
