

244 Remarks on Tuesday June 9th 1845
these 24 hours begins with light breeze from the north & calm & pleasant weather during E & SE watch employed in boiling out our blackfish blubber the forenoon to land chasing blackfish & one merchant barque off our lee bow at 4 P.M. finished boiling at sun down shot down sail at 9 calm breeze & latter part of the day light breeze from the N.W. & calm at 5 P.M. breeze from N.W. & E the land off our lee bow during the same watch employed in taking up some of the board net rigging saw some porpoise the day ends with light winds Lat in 32° 33' 21" N Long in 156° 38' 38" W

245 Remarks on Wednesday June 10th 1845
these 24 hours begins with light breeze from the N.W. & fine weather during E & SE watch employed in spinning Spungarn the forenoon off our lee bow at sun down put to sea & main sail & reefed the fore top sail & kept our course E & SE breeze & latter part of the day fine breeze from N.W. & fair weather but cloudy the watch employed in spinning Spungarn the day ends with same breeze Lat in 32° 33' 01" N Long in 156° 38' 10" W

246 Remarks on Thursday June 11th 1845
these 24 hours begins with moderate breeze from N.W. & cloudy weather during E & SE at 1 P.M. the wind hauled to the north & began to rain & thick weather the wind hauled round to Eastward at 4 P.M. double reefed top sails at 7 P.M. in the fore top sail & reefed the fore sail middle part rainy & thick weather latter part more clear but passing squalls of fog & small rain at 8 P.M. made all necessary sail watch employed in this duty the day ends cloudy Lat in 32° 24' N Long in 156° 38' 15" W

247 Remarks on Friday June 12th 1845
these 24 hours begins with fresh breeze from East & thick weather by 4 P.M. & passing squalls of small rain during by the wind to the N.E. under easy sail watch employed in this duty at 4 P.M. took in the fore & main sail at 7 P.M. took in the fore top sail & were light to the S.W. & reefed the fore sail latter part of the day light winds & fine weather at 8 P.M. made sail & tacked ship to the S.E. at 10 tacked to the north watch employed in spinning Spungarn at 11 the wind hauled round to the north was ship & reefed E & E light winds & fine weather to end this day Lat in 32° 06' N Long in 156° 38' 38" W

248 Remarks on Saturday June 13th 1845
these 24 hours begins with light winds from the north & fine weather pleasant & moderate during E & SE watch employed in spinning Spungarn at sun down shot down sail during E & SE breeze & latter part of the day fresh breeze from the westward & cloudy weather at 6 P.M. made all necessary sail saw one big heavy weather at 7 P.M. under E & SE watch employed in washing & mending then at 10 P.M. the wind hauled to the N.W. & began to blow on the day ends cloudy & thick weather by 1 P.M. the day Lat in 32° 12' 28" N Long in 156° 32' 00" W

249 Remarks on Sunday June 14th 1845
these 24 hours begins with fresh breeze from N.W. & thick weather during the forenoon by the wind watch employed in washing & mending then at one long to windward during by the wind to the Eastward merchant vessel at sun down shot down sail middle & latter part of the day fresh breeze from the north & a heavy swell on at 8 P.M. made sail at 4 P.M. put 11 toward the west & toward part of a fresh breeze at long side saw black fish the day ends with moderate breeze Lat in 32° 52' N Long in 156° 28' 28" W

250 Remarks on Monday June 15th 1845
these 24 hours begins with moderate breeze from the north & a heavy swell on at 1 P.M. we heisted in our deck frame & steered E & E the wind hauled to the north we caught plenty of black small fish round the rudder at sun down shot down sail & steered by the wind to the N.W. & SE breeze & latter part of the day fine breeze from N.W. & fair weather & a heavy swell blowing from the north at 8 P.M. made sail at 8 P.M. E & SE watch employed in this duty at midnight steered by the wind to the north to end this day nothing in light Lat in 33° 28' N Long in 156° 42' 42" W

251 Remarks on Tuesday June 16th 1845
these 24 hours begins with moderate winds from N.W. & fair weather under all sail during by the wind to the north watch employed in spinning Spungarn at 5 P.M. calm took in sail & lay under double reef main top sail at 10 P.M. the wind hauled from E & E & began to thicken up & rain & breeze on at 7 P.M. were ship to the N.W. & at the fore sail at 10 P.M. cleared the foremast the day ends with fair weather at the fore & fore sail Lat in 33° 29' N Long in 156° 56' 42" W
