

252 Remarks on Wednesday June 17th 1848
There 24 hours begins with moderate breeze from E & fair weather
steering by the wind to the NW watch employed in spinning
Manganese at 1 PM turned the rps out the blocks & let the main
sail the hinner halling to the north at 3 PM hauled ship to the
E & at 4 PM down shot down sail the wind halling round
to the westward at 5 PM made all sail & stand North slowly
weather watch employed in spinning Manganese & other kinds of
work saw 3 flocks of Aquila thick, with fair weather the
wind from the NW at 6 PM down stand NE & E
Lat in by log 34.15 or long in by Chronometer 49.55 West

253 Remarks on Thursday June 18th 1848
There 24 hours begins with good weather & a fine breeze from the
NW steering E & E watch employed in ship duty at 3 PM
the E & the NW saw passed at 4 PM down shot down sail & stand by the
wind to the North Middle & latter part of the day moderate breeze &
fair weather slowly & overcast at 8 PM was ship to the NW at
5 PM made sail & stand from NW to the NW at 6 PM watch
employed in ship duty about the rigging at 7 PM down stand East
Lat in by log 34.45 or long in by Chronometer 49.23 West

254 Remarks on Friday June 19th 1848
There 24 hours begins with light winds from the NW & fine weather
steering East watch employed about the rigging at 4 PM down shot down
sail & stand by the wind to the North latter part of the day
moderate breeze from the NW at 3 PM was ship to the NW at
5 PM made sail saw one grampus breck out at 7 PM down stand
watch employed in ship duty slowly & overcast weather at 10 PM
at 11 PM down stand East to new this day
Lat in by log 34.50 or long in by Chronometer 48.20 West

255 Remarks on Saturday June 20th 1848
There 24 hours begins with moderate breeze from the NW & slowly
weather steering East watch employed in ship duty about
the rigging & picking cotton saw finbacks at 4 PM down shot down
sail & stand by the wind to the North Middle & latter part of the day
light winds at 2 PM was ship to the NW it came in thick fog
at 5 PM made sail at 6 PM down stand & at 7 PM the fog cleared off saw
one sail bearing SE stand by him watch employed in washing &
manganese there close the day new fine weather but slowly
Lat in by log 34.50 or long in by Chronometer 47.42 West

256 Remarks on Sunday June 21st 1848
There 24 hours begins with light winds from the NW & slowly weather
under all sail steering SE watch employed in washing & manganese there
close one sail off our lee bow steering to the NE at 3 PM were picked
up a log at 6 PM the big Sloop of Matthew's 20 Marks
out 9 PM down shot down sail the hinner came on board at 10 PM down
shot down sail steering by the wind to the NW at 9 PM watch
employed in washing & manganese on board latter part of the day light winds
from the North & fine weather & some flying fog at 5 PM down
stand all sail steering to the westward close off our lee board
quartered at 8 PM down shot down sail between us & Sloop going quick
to 14 M down stand for them but could not get fast came on board
& stand for them they went out light to the NW saw one Merchant
barque steering to the Eastward passed to windward of us & hauled
back & i sent the boat to him he was 18 days from Charleston
found the barque loaded with lumber bunch ship at 11 PM
the boat came on board & we stand to the westward bearing west
saw at 11 PM finbacks the day new with light winds & fine weather
Lat in by log 34.52 or long in by Chronometer 47.30 West

257 Remarks on Monday June 22nd 1848
There 24 hours begins with light winds from the NW & fine weather
steering West by the wind big Sloop to windward of us at 3 PM
the Sloop & i went on board of him at 4 PM down shot down
sail & stand i came on board calm latter part of the day light breeze from
the NW & fine weather at 5 PM made sail & stand by the wind to the
NW at 6 PM the Sloop off our lee board quartered steering the same watch
employed in pumping all the fresh water out of the ground keel in
the after hole which was 5 cask saw finbacks & Aquila the day new
light winds hauled ship to the NW
Lat in by log 34.22 or long in by Chronometer 48.00 West

258 Remarks on Tuesday June 23rd 1848
There 24 hours begins with light winds from the NW & fine weather steering
by the wind to the Eastward watch employed in steering off the after hole
the big Sloop of our lee quarter steering to the westward at 2 PM we were
round at 4 PM down shot down sail Middle & latter part of the day light
winds from the NW & fine weather at 5 PM made sail steering by the
wind to the NW & Sloop off our lee quarter steering the same at
11 PM down stand out of light to new this day
Lat in by log 34.50 or long in by Chronometer 47.30 West
