261 Remarks on Friday June 26th 1848
These 24 hours begins with moderate breeze from SE & fine weather
under all sail during the night the watch employed in ship's
duty the brig alone off our weather beam during the same at 3 AM
lowered after blackfish got near came on board & steered to the NW &
the Solon then to the SE at sun down station sail nothing in sight
middle & latter part of the day fine breeze from SE & fine weather
at 5 AM made sail at 8 AM made ship to the NW watch employed
in ship's duty at 11 AM saw a sail off our lee beam kept off for him

at 9 PM I came on board during the night the SE under that sail
middle & latter part of the day fine breeze from the SE & fine weather
at 5 AM made sail & steered SE & several sails in whole vessels watch
employed in ship's duty the day ends fine weather Steered East
Lat in by 33.10 & long in by Chronometer 110.10 West

267 Remarks on Wednesday July 1st 1848
These 24 hours begins with moderate breeze from the SE & fine weather
During the night watch employed in ship's duty the Solon in sight saw pumps
at sun down station sail & steered by the wind to the SE latter part of
the day fine breeze & fine weather at 5 AM were ship at 8 AM made sail
saw the Solon at 9 AM the brig D. Franklin spoke we kept Steered
came on board 2 AM at 10 AM went back & were Steered west & ended this day
Lat in by 34.07 & long in by Chronometer 110.15 West
