shotone sail middle & latter part of the day light winds from the N &
& fine weather watch employed in fitting the breast blocks one strong
sail Steering to the N & E at 9 PM saw black fish & passed the day
light winds one sail in sight to windward Steering before the wind
Lat in by 34 41 N long in by Chronometer 47 20 West

Here 24 hours begins with light winds from the N & fine
pleasant weather Steering by the wine to the N & E watch employed
in making Mustelins out blocks one strong sail to windward
at sun down shotone sail headed West to the wine sailing to the N &
middle & latter part of the day fine breeze from the N & E & passing clouds of
rain by 5 PM at 5 PM made all sail Steering by the wine to the N & E
watch employed in ship duty finished the new best grips at 11 PM
headed to windward & thereat saw them off the weather beam
to into the day fair weather

PM tacked ship to the N & E watch employed in ship duty at sun down

& fine weather at 5 PM made sail & 5 PM at 8 PM Steering to
the westward at 8 PM 5 PM tacked ship to the N & E saw several pieces
of liquor the day new fine weather
Lat in by 34 05 N long in by Chronometer 48 33 West

283 Remarks on Friday July 17th 1845
Here 24 hours begins with moderate winds from E & N & fine weather
Steering by the wine to the N & E at sun down shotone sail middle
& latter part of the day fine breeze from E & N & some passing clouds of
rain at 5 PM made sail saw the big tops Steering to the N & E at 7
PM went out of sight at 11 PM tacked ship to the N & E the day new with
& fine breeze & fair weather
Lat in by 34 05 N long in by Chronometer 48 45 West
