

297 Remarks on Friday July 31st 1845
These 24 hours begins with light airs & wind from the NW & fine pleasant weather. Steady by the wind to the westward watch employed in ship duty about the rigging at 5 PM calm at sun down boat in all but a double reef main topsail at 8 PM the wind bears from the SE made sail & then by the wind to the NW watch employed in ship duty fitting the 12th gun deck sharpening them & taking up the main sail postures & rigging on the day ends with light winds
Set in by 34.21 at long in by Chronometer 15.17 West

298 Remarks on Saturday August 1st 1846
These 24 hours begins with light winds from the NE & fine weather. Steady by the wind to the NW watch employed in ship duty taking up the 12th gun & other various kinds of work at 4 PM took ship to the NW & saw blackfish & porpoise at sun down shot down sail & was ship & headed up 1 PM middle & latter part of the day light winds & fine weather at 5 made sail saw two merchant vessels Steady by the NE watch employed in washing & mending them at 6 PM took ship & headed E at 8 PM the day ends nothing in light airy calm & fine pleasant weather
Set in by 34.30 at long in by Chronometer 15.20 West

299 Remarks on Sunday August 2nd 1846
These 24 hours begins with light winds from SE & fine pleasant weather. Steady by the wind to the NW watch employed in washing & mending them at 3 PM nearly calm at sun down shot down sail middle & latter part of the day light airs from NW & calm at 5 PM made sail Steady by the wind went the west wind the day ends the same saw grampuses
Set in by 34.36 at long in by Chronometer 15.15 West

300 Remarks on Monday August 3rd 1846
These 24 hours begins with light airs of wind from NE & calm Steady by the wind to the NW watch employed in ship duty about the rigging at 4 PM saw the big gun off our weather bow at 5 PM made sail Steady by the wind to the NW watch employed in ship duty at 6 PM took ship & headed SE the day ends with light winds from NW
