

305 Remarks on Saturday August 8th 1845
Here 24 hours begins with a fine breeze from the N.W. & smooth weather. Misting & light watch employed on board at sun down shortened sail & steered by the wind to the N.W. at 1 o'clock were ship to the north latter part of the day light winds from the N.W. & fine weather at 5 o'clock made sail & steered N.E. & watch employed in washing & mending there close at 10 picked up a large ship mast the day more light winds nothing in sight
Lat in by 34.34 N Long in by Chronometer 13.30 West

306 Remarks on Sunday August 9th 1845
Here 24 hours begins with light winds from the N.W. & fine weather Misting & light watch employed in washing & mending there close saw one piece of squid on foredeck at sun down shortened sail & steered by the wind to the N.W. middle & latter part of the day light breeze & calm at 9 o'clock made sail & steered N.E. the day more light winds & fine weather
Lat in by 34.45 N Long in by Chronometer 13.00 West

307 Remarks on Monday August 10th 1845
Here 24 hours begins with light winds from the N.W. & fine weather & pleasant Misting & light watch employed at sun down shortened sail & steered by the wind to the N.W. middle & latter part of the day moderate breeze from the N.W. & fine weather at 5 o'clock made sail at 7 o'clock down the foretop sail & commenced repairing it the day more the same steady breeze
Lat in by 35.12 N Long in by Chronometer 12.42 West

308 Remarks on Tuesday August 11th 1845
Here 24 hours begins with moderate winds from the N.W. & fine weather Misting & light watch employed in mending the foretop sail at 2 o'clock saw white water flying N.E. & steered for it it proved to be some small fish jumping out at a time & at 5 o'clock went to the foretop sail at sun down shortened sail & steered by the wind to the N.W. at 1 o'clock were ship to the north at 5 o'clock saw one merchant brig steering to the N.E. fine breeze from the westward & rugged the day more the same nothing in sight at 10 o'clock
Lat in by 35.44 N Long in by Chronometer 12.17 West

309 Remarks on Wednesday August 12th 1845
Here 24 hours begins with fresh breeze from the westward & rugged sea Misting & light watch employed on board at sun down double reefed the topsails & steered through the night latter part of the day strong breeze from the westward & rugged sea on at 5 o'clock made sail & steered N.E. at 10 o'clock & steered the day more fair weather & rugged sea on
Lat in by 35.40 N Long in by Chronometer 10.10 West

310 Remarks on Thursday August 13th 1845
Here 24 hours begins with fresh breeze from the westward & smooth weather & at rugged sea on steering & close at sun down double reefed topsails latter part of the day fresh breeze from the westward & smooth weather at 5 o'clock made sail watch employed in fitting up the foretop sail over the stern the day more nothing in sight
Lat in by 37.46 N Long in by Chronometer 30.20 West

311 Remarks on Friday August 14th 1845
Here 24 hours begins with a fresh breeze from the westward & smooth weather Misting & light watch employed in ship's duty at 2 o'clock the wind backed out north & kept steering eastward made all sail steering by the wind to the Eastward at sun down double reefed topsails steering by the wind backing from E to N.W. latter part of the day light winds from N.W. & fine weather at 5 o'clock made all sail backing from E to N.W. at 9 o'clock picked up a log at 11 o'clock saw a schooner head the day more light winds
Lat in by 38.44 N Long in by Chronometer 37.10 West

312 Remarks on Saturday August 15th 1845
Here 24 hours begins with light winds from N.W. & fine weather Misting by the wind backing & light watch employed in ship's duty one schooner off our sternward bow at sun down shortened sail at 3 o'clock the wind backed N.E. were ship & backed & at 5 o'clock made all sail light winds & fine weather watch employed in washing & mending there close at 7 o'clock steered the day more light winds from the north & fine weather
Lat in by 38.11 N Long in by Chronometer 35.50 West
