

321 Remarks on Monday August 24th 1845
Here 24 hours begins with light winds from NW & fair weather
during which for the 12 part of hours at 6 PM then by the wind
at 1 PM down station sail middle & latter part of the day light winds
from the westward & fine weather at 2 PM made all sail & then
in for logs at 7 PM i went on shore after potatoes & onions
at 8 PM we got all the potatoes & onions on board fine weather

322 Remarks on Tuesday August 25th 1845
Here 24 hours begins with light winds from the westward & fine weather
beginning off & on at the tower of logs at 4 PM came on board &
found 18 lbs for log all at 1 PM down from 12 lbs. Main sail & reef
the fore top sail middle & latter part of the day moderate breeze from
the N & fair weather during by the wind backing SE & NE
at 1 PM sail in light water employed in washing there close the day over
the same Let in by 37.10 at long in by Chronometer 30.00 West

323 Remarks on Wednesday August 26th 1845
Here 24 hours begins with moderate winds from the N & fair weather
under all sail during by the wind backing SE & NE watch
employed in washing there close several sails in light at 1 PM down
double reefed the top sails & then 18 lbs for log in light
latter part of the day fine breeze from NW & passing close at
5 PM made all sail during 18 lbs to pass to the windward of
fogel several strong sails in light water employed in ship duty
at 8 PM we took the day over the same
Let in by 37.11 at long in by Chronometer 20.55 West

324 Remarks on Thursday August 27th 1845
Here 24 hours begins with a fine breeze from NW & passing close
under all sail during 18 lbs several strong sails in light fogel
& fire in light at 6 PM 14 lbs breeze & high in light at 7 PM
at the watch & stood hole watches in fogel passage 8 miles from the
town at 8 PM commenced raining the wind backed to the Eastward thick
weather & heavy rains through the night latter part of the day strong
breeze thick weather rainy by 12 lbs at 1 PM of high in light & fogel
& fire in light by 12 lbs at 1 PM we took the day over the same
double reefed the top sails at 10 PM off NW & made sail turn
the reef out main top sail & 14 lbs at 1 PM we took the day over the same
the day over thick weather by 12 lbs & at 1 PM we took the day over the same
sunny Let in by 38.21 at long in by Chronometer 29.00 West

325 Remarks on Friday August 28th 1845
Here 24 hours begins with strong breeze from the ESE & thick weather by
12 lbs & at 1 PM we took the day over the same
main top sail full of tallentons & main sail water employed in
putting potatoes down the after hold. Mr. Macomber took below
at 6 PM passed 2 ships & one barque during by the wind to the south
at 7 PM reefed the main top sail & put on the datch bars at 8 PM
the wind began to moderate at 8 PM made sail the work had several
fif. epileptic Mr. Macomber took rope near top sail below
& 12 lbs at 1 PM we took the day over the same
the day over with moderate breeze from ESE & fair weather
Let in by 37.44 at long in by Chronometer 31.42 West

326 Remarks on Saturday August 29th 1845
Here 24 hours begins with moderate breeze from ESE & fair weather
during which Mr. Macomber & the work off duty took
at 4 PM saw two strong ships during to the N & E by the wind at 8 PM
began to back to the north middle & latter part of the day moderate
breeze & variable & some passing showers of rain during from NW & E
which when the wind will allow us to watch employed in washing
there close the day over with moderate breeze from NW & fair weather
Let in by 37.10 at long in by Chronometer 33.15 West

327 Remarks on Sunday August 30th 1845
Here 24 hours begins with light winds from NW & fair weather
under all sail during by the wind to the westward watch employed
in washing & mending there close Mr. Macomber & the work off duty
took below middle & latter part of the day light winds & variable
& calm & some small rain by 12 lbs at 7 PM saw one strong ship
the day over calm & pleasant weather
Let in by 37.05 at long in by Chronometer 33.30 West

328 Remarks on Monday August 31st 1845
Here 24 hours begins calm & pleasant weather one ship in light
at 1 PM at light breeze blowing up from NW then weather under
all sail at 4 PM calm at 1 PM 3 sperm whales came up east to the
town & by 15 minutes at 5 PM the wind backed from the SE then by
the wind to the NW at 6 PM saw a school of whales at 7 PM came to the
& galley then at 10 PM came on board & then for them the day over with
fine weather & a plenty of whale in light off our bow
Let in by 38.51 at long in by 33.51 West



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
