Three 24 hours begins with moderate winds from ESE & fine weather & at
5 PM a sperm whale is sighted at 1 PM lowered for him & got on to
the Harvard boat & killed him & the next day for life took him at

got down the whole & made him & then he was 14 & 1/2 the water &
they were employed in clearing flukes fins & jaw fine weather & at fine

330 Remarks on Wednesday Sept 2d 1845
Three 24 hours begins with light winds from the Eastward & fine weather
during both all hands employed in cutting junk at 1 PM made
a fire & commenced boiling head on a stove & dinner in light
at 2 PM finished cutting the junk then went middle & latter part
of the day moderate breeze & fine weather all hands employed on
board boiling saw one big & saw grasshoppers all hands on duty
the day into fine weather boiling
Left in by 35.21 or long in by Chronometer 35.25 West

331 Remarks on Thursday Sept 3d 1845
Three 24 hours begins with light winds from the Eastward & fine
weather during both all hands employed on board boiling
saw grasshoppers breaching middle & latter part of the day light winds
& fine weather at 4 PM finished boiling at 8 PM saw at school
of sperm whales at 8 PM lowered & got fast to the Harvard boat
& he took the line & the lumbered boats line bent to it & went off
the day into light breeze from the NW & fine weather off showing
whale so near the day
Left in by 35.44 or long in by Chronometer 37.50 West

332 Remarks on Friday Sept 4th 1845
Three 24 hours begins with light winds from the NW & fine weather
boats off aft. whale at 2 PM the Harvard boat came on board
& got the line & black fish line & went off at 3 PM at 4 PM the
Harvard boat got fast to a large whale & got him to the cutting
blood came on night the whale began to hold on all night with
both boats at day light came on equally & were commenced clearing
the whole strong breeze from NW & ruggid at midday killed the
whale at long line & killed him so near ruggid
Left in by 36.01 or long in by Chronometer 38.22 West



333 Remarks on Saturday Sept 5th 1845
Three 24 hours begins with strong breeze from NW & ruggid sea on at 4
past 2 PM hooked on to the whale & commenced cutting the head at 4 PM
down got the head nearly half off left off work & let the water
& then 6 watches through the night much better part of the day fresh
breeze & ruggid weather at 6 PM called all hands & commenced cutting
on the whole the day into all hands employed in cutting & ruggid weather
Left in by 36.11 or long in by Chronometer 38.67 West

334 Remarks on Sunday Sept 6th 1845
Three 24 hours begins with fresh breeze from the NW & fair weather but
ruggid sea on all hands employed in cutting in our whale at 7 PM
got the head cut off & the body all in let the water & went to boiling
body latter part of the day more moderate & moderating down
at 10 PM called down the fire & board on to the junk & took it
in saw one fish the day into with light winds from the Eastward
& fine weather some squally all hands employed in cutting off the junk
Left in by 36.31 or long in by Chronometer 38.38 West

335 Remarks on Monday Sept 7th 1845
Three 24 hours begins with light winds from the Eastward & fine weather
all hands employed in cutting in the whole head at 2 PM the 24th
castles of London spoke us from Calcutta bound to London at 3 PM
we commenced boiling at 3 PM & boiling the case at 7 PM got all
on board & let the water much & latter part of the day light breeze &
calms all hands employed in cutting up blubber boiling & breaking out
the after hole to show down oil the day into fine weather & calm
Left in by 36.37 or long in by Chronometer 38.49 West

336 Remarks on Tuesday Sept 8th 1845
Three 24 hours begins with calm weather & pleasant & smooth sea on
all hands employed in cutting up blubber boiling & showing down oil
in the after hole at 1 PM down left of showing got down 27 barrels &
let the water light breeze from the NW middle & latter part of the day fine
weather all hands employed in cutting up junk & boiling at 8 PM were
ship to the NW to the day into fine weather boiling
Left in by 36.44 or long in by Chronometer 38.55 West
