Three 24 hours begins with strong winds from S.W. & heavy rain on steering by the wind to the N. & W. under-stand reef topsails
at 11 AM the wind freshens & the sea is very rough & the ship is rolling down
the leeward side of the mainmast at 3 PM the wind moderates
the latter part of the day moderate winds from N.W. & smooth
weather at 5 PM the double reef topsails come in & the sea is
very heavy & the ship is rolling to the eastward watch empty, I am
rotting & taring the rigging the day ends smooth weather
Lat in by 34.13 N Long in by Chronometer 44.19 West

3418 Remarks on Friday Sept 18th 1845
Three 24 hours begins with moderate winds from N.W. & smooth
weather & ruggid steering by the wind to the N.W. all hands employed
in rotting & taring the rigging at 8 PM the wind blows to the east then
at 10 PM the latter part of the day fresh breeze from East & fair weather & ruggid
steering watch empty on the rigging rotting & taring the day ends
moderate winds

3417 Remarks on Saturday Sept 19th 1845
Three 24 hours begins with moderate winds from E.S.E. & fair weather
steering with small hands empty in rotting & taring down the
rigging took up the potatoes on the turn & boiled them & put them in
the bin over the turn at sun down left of work at 9 PM the wind
began to blow to the south made all sail latter part of the day fresh
breeze from N.W. & smooth weather & ruggid & going ruggid water
empty in taring down the rigging the day ends the duty light
the day ends ruggid & strong breeze
Lat in by 34.40 N Long in by Chronometer 48.55 West

3418 Remarks on Sunday Sept 20th 1845
Three 24 hours begins with strong breeze from S.W. & smooth weather
& at ruggid sea on steering with all hands empty in taring
down the rigging at 1 PM took in topgallant sail & double reefed the
topsails at 4 PM reefed the topsails at 2 PM the wind began to blow to
the north & moderate down at 4 PM made sail at 7 PM wore ship &
steered to the east with at light breeze from the N.E. & at 10 PM the
breeze from the N.W. to the day ends with at light breeze & fair weather
Lat in by 35.00 N Long in by Chronometer 49.53 West

3419 Remarks on Monday Sept 21st 1845
Three 24 hours begins with light winds from the eastward & smooth
weather & at heavy swell arising from the N.W. steering with all
hands put five bars at 3 PM the wind began to blow to the south
squalls of rain from 4 to 8 AM took out the clutter-room after sail
at 8 PM fair weather all hands empty in bending sails the day ends
the same & fair weather steering with all hands by the wind
Lat in by 34.51 N Long in by Chronometer 51.45 West

350 Remarks on Tuesday Sept 22nd 1845
Three 24 hours begins with moderate winds from S.W. & fair
weather steering by the wind to the N.W. all hands empty in
bending sails but new main topsails for sail & topsails & J.R.
& for topgallant sail at 9 PM the wind began to blow to the west
ward at 11 PM began to blow on & grew ruggid began to take in
sail latter part of the day strong winds from N.W. & at
ruggid sea on steering by the wind steering from N.W. to N.E.
under-stand reef topsails for sail & reef topsails & topsails
watch empty in this duty various kinds of work on board
to end the day

351 Remarks on Wednesday Sept 23rd 1845
Three 24 hours begins with strong winds from the N.W. & ruggid
sea on steering by the wind steering from N.W. to N.E. under-stand
sail watch empty in this duty at 1 PM began to moderate
at 4 PM took down the potatoes from over the turn at sun down
wore ship & made all sail at 7 PM reefed out the topsails at
11 PM squally & raining by shells latter part of the day light winds from
the N.W. & fair weather at 3 PM made all sail at 8 PM commenced
repairing the old main topsails the day ends with light winds from
the N.W. steering by the wind to the westward
Lat in by 35.30 N Long in by Chronometer 52.40 West

352 Remarks on Thursday Sept 24th 1845
Three 24 hours begins with light winds from the N.W. & fair weather
under all sail steering by the wind to the westward steering from
N.W. to N.E. all hands empty in mending the old main
topsails at 5 PM finished it & put it forward at 9 PM calm
much part calm latter part light breeze from the eastward at 8 PM
steered with all hands empty in painting the foreboard & waist
boards the day ends with light winds from N.E. & fair weather
Lat in by 35.10 N Long in by Chronometer 53.00 West
finished mending the Cabin
