Wednesday
the 14th this day commences with light
winds from the S^W steering one the
winds with all sail three sail in
sight middle part the same latter
part five water saw two ship at whaling
saw these 24 hours in the Lat 57-10
Long

Thursday
the 15th this day commences with light winds
from the S^W steering by the wind with all
out two ship in sight middle part the same
latter part five saw right whale towards the
west boat so on there 24 hours in the
Lat 58-2

Friday
the 16th this day commences with light
winds from the S^W steering by the wind
with all sail out two sail in sight saw
whale all round middle part stevedore
spitting to, at anchor latter part saw right
whale towards the boat so on there 24 hours
Lat 58-20 Long 173-2

Saturday
the 17th At 7 Yam
this day commences with light wind
from the S^W steering at with all
out saw whale and five ships towards the
boat west and stevedore middle part the
same latter part the yoke at stevedore
finer man so on there 24 hours
in the Lat 59-39 Long 175-37
At 7 Yam

Sunday
the 18th this day commences with light winds
from the S^W steering at with all
sail out five ship in sight middle
part the same latter saw birch bark at
10 etc to sun through the ice saw six ship
at twelve the ice all round so on
these 24 hours in Lat 60-56
Long 176 E
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
