

Monday
the 1st

Day
this day commenced strong wind from
the SE steering ESE along the ice
five ships in sight spoke the John & C
in 11th London and saw the Bourgal
which part saw ship boiling on the
ice before latter part saw twelve ship at
11 o'clock saw the ice so ends these 24 hours
in the Litt 61-17 Leg 178-48

Tuesday
the 2nd

Snow
this day commenced with light winds
from the ESE steering to the S with
all sail at nine ship in sight from
which part the same latter
part foggy saw one ship so ends these 24
hours in the Litt 61-17 Leg 178

Wednesday
the 3rd

this day commenced with light winds
from the SE flying two tows
heaving to the E which part the same
foggy latter part made all sail
steering ESE one ship in sight and
so ends these 24 hours in Litt 60-58

Thursday
the 4th

this day commenced strong wind
from the E steering day the wind
to the N with all sail out at 8 o'clock
ship to the S took in top gallant sail
double reef the top sail one ship of the
ice saw no wind in top gallant mast
of which part raining latter part

latter part made sail saw hundred and
board the boats at three o'clock in the E 11
so ends these 24 hours Litt 61-36

Friday
the 5th

this day commenced with calm
shift the gale at middle part
foggy and latter part the same
saw two ship spoke the flower of storming
ten so ends these 24 hours no Litt

Saturday
the 6th

this day commenced with light wind
from the ESE steering by the wind
to the N which part the same latter
part one ship sight foggy so ends
these 24 hours Litt 61-36

Sunday
the 7th

this day commenced light wind
from the SE steering at 8 o'clock with all
sail set foggy which part the same
latter part saw the ice and ship at 8 o'clock
steering for the ice at 7 o'clock in the ice again
so ends these 24 hours foggy Litt

Monday
the 8th

Sounding 8 ft
this day commenced with light winds
from the SE steering by the wind for sail
and mainsail at middle part cleared
on some latter part saw a ship and
the ice so ends these 24 hours
in the Litt 62-28
