Monday this day commenced with
the 18 strong winds from the S steering
by the wind the ice all round in one
ship in sight foggy with ice which
part the same went aboard the straits
to meeting three ship in sight latter
part gaining with the straits so ends
these 24 hours in the left

Monday this day commenced with light
the 16 winds from the E & steering
by the wind the straits in sight
middle part the same foggy latter
part the same so ends these 24 hours

Tuesday this day commenced with light
the 17 winds from the S steering by the
with all sail out the ice of the weather
beam at seven o'clock the ice all
round in middle part calm & straits
and abgail so gather toward of the ice
latter part the seven twelve ship
sight so ends these 24 hours

Thursday this day commenced with light winds
the 18 from the S steering by the wind with
all sail out twelve ship in sight Fair lane
straits pharret the land ten miles of middle
part the same land the boats chased but
did not strike so ends these 24 hours
in the
Bering straits

Friday this day commenced with light wind
the 19 from the S steering in the straits 16 ship
in sight landed the boats and chased
the water dam along side to trade
middle part the same latter part
saw low head landed the boat so
ends these 24 hours no whales

Saturday this day commenced with
the 20 light winds from the S & steering
one ship to anchor the Chary Mitchell
saw low head of middle part
landed the boat spoke the abgail
raining latter strong wind from the
S steering by the wind so ends
these 24 hours

Sunday this day commenced with light
the 21 from the S steering by the
wind with all sail out 14 ship the
harbour on of sag harbour middle
part now of the land both side
latter part landed the low boat spoke
the Chary & so ends these 24 hours
