

Friday
the 5th latter part heard for whales spoke the coastline
of St. George so ends these 24 hours

Saturday
the 6th this day commences with light wind from
the S steering by the wind ten ships in sight
middle part heard for whales & several live seals
latter part spoke the tides - latter part the ice in
sight so ends these 24 hours

Sunday
the 7th this day commences with light wind from
the S steering in the straits saw one head on ship
in sight heard the boats etc. latter part the live seal
boat came on board latter saw whales 10 ships in
sight spoke for weather heard these 24 hours

Monday
the 8th this day commences with light wind
from the S steering to the W with all
out saw 20 ships of all deck middle part the
land 10 miles of latter part spoke the Henry
Tomson so ends these 24 hours

Tuesday
the 9th this day commences with strong breeze
from the S steering to the E with all sail out
ten ship in sight middle part calm middle
part the latter five ship in sight so ends
these 24 hours Lett 64

Wednesday
the 10th this day commences with light wind
from the S steering in the straits with
all sail out middle part the same latter
part sent down the main sail to mend
8 ship in sight the land 20 miles
of so ends these 24 hours Lett 65

Thursday
the 11th this day commences with light wind from the S
steering to the S with all sail out middle part
the same spoke the Chedocum and passed wheels
and heard latter part under double reef top sail
so ends these 24 hours Lett 66

Friday
the 12th this day commences with light wind
from the S steering by the wind under double
reef top sail middle part the same latter part foggy
saw ten ship spoke the Mary Johnson so
ends these 24 hours

Saturday
the 13th this day commences with light wind from
the S steering by the wind to the S with all sail
out giving with 8 ship middle part the same latter
part the same so ends these 24 hours 66

Sunday
the 14th this day commences with light wind from
the S steering in to St. Lawrence bay at three
o'clock took up twelve ship in sight middle part
had the boom on deck to dry middle part steering
up the straits 8 ship in sight at 12 o'clock had
over wind so ends these 24 hours

Monday
the 15th this day commences with strong wind
from the S steering by the wind at 8 o'clock
spoke the Pilot at anchor at 4 o'clock we
anchor in St. James water foggy middle part
the same latter part took the anchor the ice
came down on us made sail the land on
side and ice on the other one half mile apart
so we was like to go ashore we run up round the
island and anchor the two boat went ashore
so ends these 24 hours
