

Monday
the 14
this day commences with a gale from the
S 40° laying at anchor two boats went to
shore but of some wind these ship in sight
try to beat up to island middle part the same
latter part struck a drift and none of the anchor
found the stock broke the wind blowing at gale three
ship in sight so ends these 24 hours

Tuesday
the 15
this day commences with strong wind
from the S 60° beating up to the island under
double reef top sail middle part laying aback
under the lee of the land at 11 o'clock let go the
anchor three ship in sight latter part took the
anchor and made sail the wind to the N the native
canoe so ends these 24 hours

Wednesday
the 16
this day commences with slight wind
from the N steering among the ice to find
the way out foggy middle part the same
laying aback latter part 11 ship in sight
the land 20 miles of barab not for weather
so ends these 24 hours

Thursday
the 17
this day commences with light
wind from the N the ice all round
one way and the land the other stood
down the ice middle part the same
saw three ship latter part foggy so ends
these 24 hours of St L 10

Friday
the 18
this day commences with strong wind
from the S steering by the wind under
double reef top sails six ship in sight
middle part foggy spoke the heavy frigate
latter part the same so ends these
24 hours

Saturday
the 19
this commences with strong wind from the S steering
by the wind to the S under single reef top sail
foggy middle part the same three ship in sight
latter part spoke the Briggance of Peter Bedford
so ends these 24 hours of Cape Cross

Sunday
the 20
this day commences strong wind from the
S steering S 40° under top sail gaining middle
part the same spoke a Brig boat Besse
laying aback saw a ship to anchor latter part
spoke the Genett at anchor let it go the
anchor so ends these 24 hours

Monday
the 21
this day commences with light wind
from the N laying at anchor 7 ship
to anchor foggy gaining with the Briggance
middle part the same latter part foggy
way so ends these 24 hours

Tuesday
the 22
this day commences with light wind
from the S steering by the wind to the S
lower the boat for rap sack and pick up
two bark spoke the Briggance of Peter Bedford
Gorge of Bedford middle part anchored calm and
foggy latter part spoke the Obgail so
ends these 24 hours

Wednesday
the 23
this day commences with light wind
from the S laying at anchor with 18
ship middle part the same latter part
took the anchor and went in the bay
and anchor the boats went in to
the reach at Anata to get some wood
and boat of 4 load so ends these
24 hours
