

May Saturday the 15 1858

this day commences with light breezes from the N.W. steering by the wind all sail out one ship in sight middle part the same latter part spoke the Orizumba 9 months out at 10 a.m. saw the ice so ends these 24 hours

Sunday the 16

this day commences with light breezes from the N.W. steering by the wind all sail out toward the west boat and struck ice on a side of ice and got him ship in sight middle part spoke a ship latter part spoke the George of yardmen in a sinking condition went on board of her with two boats crew she has 8 feet of water in the hold so ends these 24 hours

Monday the 17

this day commences with light breezes all sail out boat fore boat load of wood from the George she struck at back of ice in wearing ship and stove in two or three outside plank break of three timbers fore side plank not think they have to leave her she is 8 months out with 80th day one week ago she had at back and lost starboard and waist boat and two men washed overboard middle part shot two latter part spoke the Bel Pike so ends these 24 hours

May Sunday the 18

this day commences with light breezes from the N.W. steering by the wind all sail out at 4.30 went on board the George middle part snowy latter part saw fin back the George and Pike to windward so ends these 24 hours

Monday the 19

this day commences with light breezes from the N.W. steering by the wind all sail out the George and Bel Panning middle part calm latter part sent the boat on board the George to see what the matter was that she did not stop for us so ends these 24 hours

Tuesday the 20

this day commences with light breezes from the N.W. steering by the wind all sail out three ship in sight of the ice beam and the George and Pike to windward middle part the same latter part ship in sight but water so ends these 24 hours

Wednesday the 21

this day commences with light breezes from the N.W. steering by the wind all sail out saw a ship looking ship in sight middle part spoke the Gas House and Navy latter part toward the in company with the Ocean for a night whale but not get him so ends these 24 hours

Thursday the 22

this day commences with light breezes from the N.W. steering by the wind all sail out ship in sight middle part toward the boats from fin back latter part
