Wednesday the 9

1852

This day commences with calm
ship in sight set up the mizen top
sails and look through at watch toward the barbed
boat a whale middle part calm latter part
saw whales and set out along side and commence cutting
in holes took him along side and commenced cutting
so ends these 24 hours in ship in sight

Thursday the 10

This day commences with light
breezes from the S.W. cutting saw whales
middle part boiling latter part same so
ship in sight so ends these 24 hours

Friday the 11

Leaves in sight
this commences with light breezes
from the S.W. the sea all round and whales
in boiling middle part the same latter
part calm down at ship in sight so
ends these 24 hours

Saturday the 12

This day commences strong
breezes from the S.W. toward the boats for
whales middle part blast reef the top sails
latter hold up fore and mizen top sail but
in the side in the tanks say that night
raining so ends these 24 hours

Sunday the 13

This day commences with strong
breezes from the S.W. set the fore top sail
middle part day latter part
the same three ship in sight
so ends these 24 hours
heading North

Monday the 14

This day commences with light
breezes from the S.W. steering east all sail
out middle part spoke the navigators at that
and L. L. Richardson saw the land latter part
toward for whale the land one mile of Cape
Thodas at ship in sight raining

Tuesday the 15

This day commences with calm and
rain toward the west boat came on board at
noon school middle part rainy the land three miles
of latter part toward the boat the west boat struck
and died the starboard struck and parted the lower
struck again and died at 4 o'clock. She struck
again and got him took him along side
and commenced cutting say ship cutting
so ends these 24 hours the same 5 miles of

Wednesday the 16

This commences with light
breezes from the S.W. cutting saw boat
down for whales at 4 o'clock. After cutting
whales all round but they middle part
latter part sailing toward for whale had
no one to strike them came along side at
4 o'clock lowered all fore boats but got nothing
so ends these 24 hours land 10 miles of

Thursday the 17

This day commences with light
breezes from the S.W. steering on the wind
toward the boats whales all round sight
on to fore as fire and piece dam hard luck
10 whales caught today and we have got none
middle part sailing latter part toward
for whales saw at ship cutting whales
raining so ends these 24 hours
