Thursday the 19

this day begins with light breeze and good weather from the S E ship heading N E by E on the starboard tack all sail set middle and latter part light breeze and good weather from the S E ship heading S all sail set so ends this day

Friday the 20

this day commences with light breeze and pleasant weather from the S E ship heading N E by S all sail set so the main topgallant studding sail and foretopmast studding sail latter part fresh breeze and good weather saw sperm whales lowered the boats and struck one and lost him

Saturday the 21

this day begins with light breeze and good weather from the S saw sperm whales and lowered and struck one and lost him middle and latter part strong breeze from the S E ship heading on either tack cruising for whales so ends this day

Sunday the 22

this day begins with strong breeze and good weather from the S E ship heading on the wind to the Eastward under short sail saw sperm whales lowered the boats got first and lost him middle and latter part light breeze and good weather from the S E ship heading S all sail set so ends this day

## Tallman Bound on a Whaling Voyage.

Monday the 23

this day commences with light breeze and good weather from the North ship heading S E all sail set cruising for whales saw none this day middle and latter part fresh breeze and good weather from the W N W ship heading S E all sail set

Tuesday the 24

this day begins with strong breeze and good weather from the W N W ship steering S E all sail set saw plenty of finbacks whales middle and latter part strong breeze and good weather from the W N W ship steering S E main top gallant sail so ends this day

Wednesday the 25

this day begins with strong breeze and rugged weather from the W N W ship steering S E double reef foretop sail and whole maintop sail broke out for water middle and latter part a gale from the W N W ship steering S E short sail so ends this day

Thursday the 26

this day begins with a gale and rugged weather from the W N W ship heading S E under moderate sail Round to New Zealand middle and latter part strong gale and squally weather from the W N W ship steering S E double reef foretop sail and single reef main so ends this day
