Saturday the 8

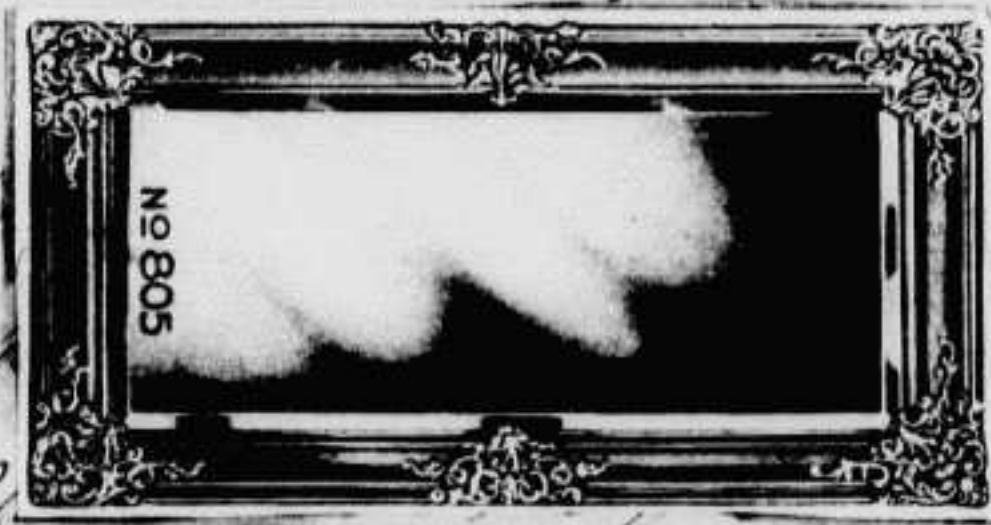

Sunday the 9

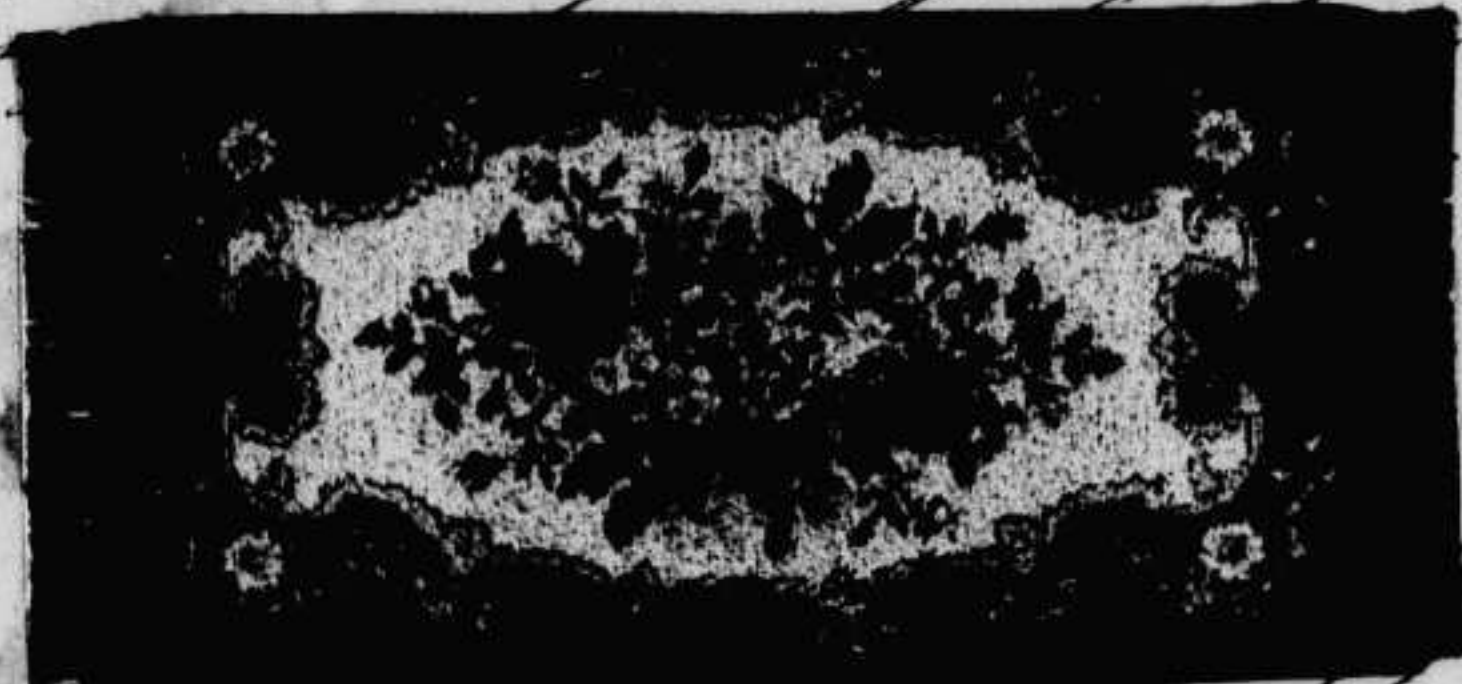
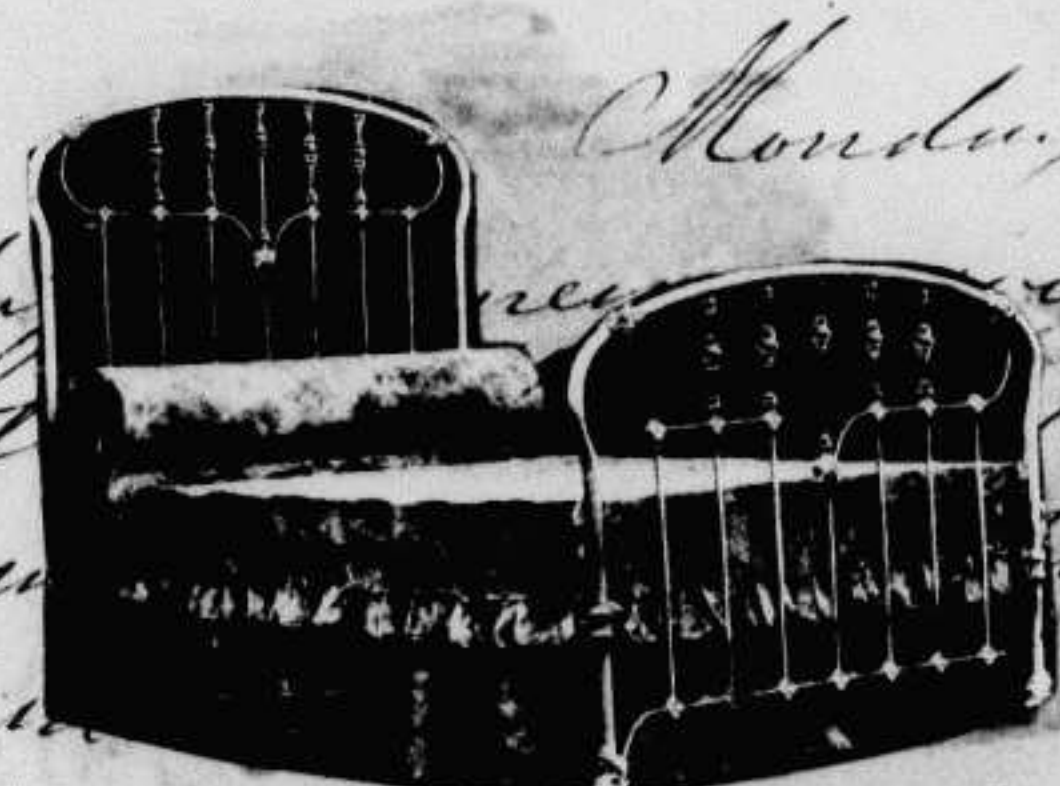
