Monday 12

this day commences with light breeze and thick weather from the N.W. ship heading to the Eastward under all sail saw one ship latter part strong breeze and thick weather from the Westward ship heading to the Northward all sail set broke out a cask of beer spoke the ship hitman capt little so ends the day

Tuesday 13

this day commences with strong breeze and thick weather from the Westward the ship heading to the Northward all sail set spoke the ship Thomas Sage of New Bedford capt. Kelly latter part light breeze and good weather from the E ship steering S.W. all sail set the land in sight employed in cleaning house Feb 55 200 Long 139 589 so ends the day

Wednesday 14

this day commences with light breeze and pleasant weather from the E ship steering W all sail set the land in sight latter part light breeze and good weather from the N.E ship steering S.W. by S all sail set the land in sight saw three ships at anchor so ends the day

Thursday 15

this day commences with thick weather ship at anchor close to the land saw the ice latter part ship laying at anchor all hands almost the weather raining saw the land and ice so ends the day

Friday 16

this day commences with light breeze and good weather took the anchor and stood out heading N.W. by E all sail set at 8 A.M. tack the ship heading S.W. all sail set thick fog latter part light breeze and thick weather the ship cruising around on either tack the land and ice not far off so ends the day

Saturday 17

this day commences with light breeze and thick weather the ship cruising around on either tack the land and ice not far off heard a gun fired latter part ship at anchor foggy weather at midnight lay two boats off cruising for whales so ends the day
