this day commences with strong breeze and good weather from the N.W. the ship steering S.W. & all sail set. spoke the Barque Louisa of New Bedford. Captain Hathaway two seasons 1400 barrels. latter part strong breeze and rugged weather from the N.W. the ship steering S.E. & double reef topsail one sail in sight broke out flour

Saturday the 6

this day commences with strong breeze and rugged weather from the N.W. the ship steering S. main top gallant sail set one sail in sight steering the same latter part strong breeze and good weather from the N.W. the ship steering S. under about sail the land in sight

Sunday the 7

this day commences with strong breeze and rugged weather from the N.W. the ship heading on with tack working up to the land the land in sight latter part breeze very rough weather from the N.W. the ship heading to the Windward the land in sight

Monday the 11

this day commences with light breeze and good weather from the N.W. the ship heading S all sail set the passage out of the port in sight latter part strong breeze and rugged weather from the N.W. the ship heading on with tack beating to the windward the land in sight the wind about

Tuesday the 12

this day commences with strong breeze and rugged weather from the N.W. the ship heading on with tack beating to the windward all sail set the land in sight latter part strong breeze and foggy weather from the N.W. the ship heading on with tack under all sail

Wednesday the 13

this day commences with strong breeze and rugged weather from the N.W. the ship heading on with tack under about sail the land in sight latter part strong breeze and rugged weather from the N.W. the ship heading S.E. & passed through the strait about 11 miles bound to the Sandwich Island
