Thursday the 18

this day commences with light breeze and some rain come to anchor in the passage latter part ship at anchor in the harbor of Pilo employed in washing ship so ends the day

Friday the 19

this day commences with the ship at anchor at Pilo employed in sending down the lead spars latter part ship at anchor at Pilo one watch ashore on liberty the to work aboard the ship so ends the day

Saturday the 20

this day commences at anchor at Pilo sandwich islands one watch ashore on liberty the other sending down the fore topmast latter part at anchor one watch ashore

Sunday the 21

this day commences at anchor at Pilo one watch ashore on liberty latter part at anchor doing nothing most all the crew ashore so ends the day

At the Sandwich Islands 1800

Monday the 22

this day commences at anchor at Pilo most of the crew ashore on liberty from November the 22 to December the 17 we lay in the harbor of Pilo discharging oil and repairing the ship and getting off water and provision and stowing of the ship

Tuesday December the 18

this day commences at anchor in the port of Pilo all hands employed in work aboard of the ship latter part laying at anchor employed in getting off provision so ends the day

Wednesday the 19

this day commences in the port of Pilo all hands employed in getting off provision and stowing it down one man in room latter part laying at anchor one watch ashore on liberty so ends the day

Thursday the 20

this day commences at anchor at Pilo one watch ashore on liberty the other aboard one man in room latter part laying at anchor employed in stowing provision so ends the day
