Thursday the 3

this day commences with strong gale from the N^W ship laying two under close reef main topsail one ship in sight laying two latter part a strong gale from the N^W ship laying two under close reef main topsail one ship in sight so ends the day

Friday the 4

this day commences with a gale from the N^W ship laying under close reef main topsail and foresail broke out 2 1/2 barrels of ice one ship in sight latter part a gale from the N^W ship laying two under close reef main topsail and foresail heaving on with tack one ship in sight so ends the day

Saturday the 5

this day commences with a gale from the N^W ship laying two under close reef main topsail heaving on with tack one ship in sight latter part strong breeze from the N^W ship under double reef topsails and courses heaving to the Eastward 2 ships in sight so ends the day

Sunday the 6

this day commences with strong breeze and good weather from the N^W ship all sail set heaving with S, D and Gid Houlard 5 ships in sight broke out water and down latter part light breeze and good weather from the N^W ship heaving on with tack saw 4 right whale 4 ships in sight gamming so ends the day

Monday the 7

this day commences with light breeze and good weather from the N^W ship all sail set heaving on with tack gamming with three ships the G, H, I, D Chandler Price latter part fresh breeze and good weather from the N^W ship with all sail set on with tack saw whales layed the boat but got nothing three ships in sight so ends the day

Tuesday the 8

this day commences with fresh breeze and good weather from the N^W ship all sail set heaving on with tack saw three ships broke out corn and slops latter part strong breeze with rain weather from the N^W ship heaving to the Eastward double reef topsails and courses set nothing in sight so ends the day
